Surface Water Certificate of Change S2-CV2P957 dated the 11th day of March 1968 authorizes the diversion of 50 cubic feet per second of water from the Deschutes River for the purpose of operation of fish trap and fishways. Said diversion point located within Section 26, Township 18 North, Range 2 West, W.M., Thurston County, Washington.

Ecology's comments are based upon information provided by the lead agency. As such, they may not constitute an exhaustive list of the various authorizations that must be obtained or legal requirements that must be fulfilled in order to carry out the proposed action.
