**Multiple Net Rule:** Drift gill net gear only. It is unlawful to use a gillnet to fish for salmon if the lead line weighs more than two pounds per fathom of net as measured on the cork line, provided that it is lawful to have a gillnet with a lead line weighing more than two pounds per fathom aboard a vessel when the vessel is fishing in or in transiting through Willapa Bay. It is unlawful to use set net gear.

It will be permissible to have onboard a commercial vessel more than one net, provided the nets are of mesh size legal for the fishery and the length of any one net does not exceed 1,500 feet in length. Nets with mesh size different from that being actively fished must be properly stored. **Only one net may be fished at a time, other nets must be properly stored.** A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope that is 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater.

All wild Chinook, non-legal sturgeon and ALL steelhead must be handled with care to minimize injury and released immediately to the river/bay

6-inch maximum mesh, no more than 55 meshes deep. Nets must hang straight from top to bottom. Strings may be used to secure breakaway panels.

Soak times are limited to 45 minutes (timed from net entering water until complete removal from water)

All fishers must carry an onboard observer, if requested by WDFW

**Multiple Net Rule:** Drift gill net gear only. It is unlawful to use set net gear. It will be permissible to have onboard a commercial vessel more than one net, provided the nets are of mesh size legal for the fishery and the length of any one net does not exceed 1,500 feet in length.

Nets with mesh size different from that being actively fished must be properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope that is 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater. **Entire net must be of single mesh size. Only one net may be fished at a time, other nets must be properly stored.** 

It is unlawful to use a gillnet to fish for salmon if the lead line weighs more than two pounds per fathom of net as measured on the cork line, provided that it is lawful to have a gillnet with a lead line weighing more than two pounds per fathom aboard a vessel when the vessel is fishing in or in transiting through Grays Harbor.
