Columbia River and Tributary Fishery Reports

Updates: Mainstem and tributary:

Salmon/Steelhead:

- **Kalama River:** until further notice, from the mouth upstream to the 6600 Road Bridge immediately downstream of Jacks Creek: Use of barbless hooks is voluntary. until further notice, from the mouth to 1,000 feet below the fishway at the upper salmon hatchery: the daily salmon limit is 6 fish, of which only 1 may be an adult.
- **Lewis River:** Effective May 1-31, 2019, Anglers should be aware the river section from Johnson Creek to the overhead power lines below Merwin Dam is closed to fishing.
- **Wind River:** Effective May 20, 2019 until further notice, from the mouth to 800 yards below Carson National Fish Hatchery: Closed to salmon and steelhead angling.
- **Drano Lake:** Effective May 20, 2019 until further notice, downstream of the markers on point of land downstream and across from Little White Salmon National fish hatchery and upstream of Highway 14 bridge: Closed to salmon and steelhead angling.
- **Klickitat River:** Effective April 1, 2019 until further notice, from the mouth to Fisher Hill Bridge: the adult salmon daily limit is one fish.
- **Klickitat River:** Effective May 25, 2019 until further notice, from 400 feet upstream from #5 fishway to boundary markers below Klickitat Salmon hatchery: the daily salmon limit is 6 fish, of which only 1 may be an adult.

Sturgeon:

- **Buoy 10 upstream to Wauna powerlines, Including adjacent Washington tributaries** — White Sturgeon open for retention fishing Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays only through June 5. Minimum size 44" fork length, maximum size 50" fork length. Daily limit 1. The fishery closes at 2PM each of those days, including catch and release.
- Wauna powerlines upstream to McNary Dam including adjacent tributaries: Closed to retention of white sturgeon but remains open for catch and release fishing only.

Fishery Reports:

Salmon/Steelhead:

Columbia River Tributaries

Elochoman River– 5 bank anglers kept 2 steelhead.

Cowlitz River – I-5 Br downstream: 21 bank rods had no catch.

Above the I-5 Br: 9 bank rods had no catch. 7 boats/14 rods kept 3 steelhead.

Tacoma Power employees recovered 49 winter-run steelhead adults, one winter-run steelhead jack, 140 spring Chinook adults, four spring Chinook jacks and 20 summer-run steelhead adults during five days of operations at the Cowlitz Salmon Hatchery separator.

During the past week Tacoma Power employees released eight winter-run steelhead adults into the Tilton River at Gust Backstrom Park in Morton and they released 22 spring Chinook adults, one spring Chinook jack and six winter-run steelhead adults into Lake Scanewa located in Randle.

Tacoma Power employees recycled 20 summer-run steelhead this week.

River flows at Mayfield Dam are approximately 2,970 cubic feet per second on Monday, May 13. Water visibility is 10 feet and the water temperature is 51.1 F.

Kalama River – 5 bank anglers had no catch. 4 boats/9 rods had no catch.

The hatchery spring Chinook escapement goal is about 500 adults. Return as of May 20 is 348 adults including 16 natural origin.

Lewis River – 1 bank angler had no catch.

The hatchery spring Chinook escapement goal is about 1,350 adults. Return as of May 20 is 472 adults including 8 natural origin.

Wind River– 31 boats/85 rods kept 9 Chinook.

The Carson National Fish Hatchery fish ladder was opened May 3 and 79 spring Chinook have returned. The hatchery escapement goal is 1,500 fish.

Drano Lake – 10 bank rods had no catch. 115 boats/309 rods kept 37 Chinook, 1 jack and released 1 Chinook.

Little White Salmon National Fish Hatchery fish ladder was opened on April 29 and 1,587 spring Chinook have returned. The hatchery escapement goal is 1,000 fish.

Klickitat – No anglers sampled.

Through May 17, a total of 40 spring Chinook adults have been counted at the Lyle Falls trap. The hatchery escapement goal is 1,100 fish.
