Fisheries Under Consideration: Treaty Commercial Sturgeon Set Line

2019 TREATY FISHERIES

Sturgeon Setline

- The 2019 Zone 6 sturgeon harvest guidelines for Treaty fisheries are 500 fish for the Bonneville Pool, 415 for The Dalles Pool and 175 fish for the John Day Pool.
- Harvest guidelines in Bonneville and The Dalles pools were met during winter gillnet fisheries, but a balance (106 fish) remained available on the John Day Pool guideline.
- Given the guideline balance, the tribes authorized a sturgeon setline fishery in the John Day Pool from 6 AM Friday June 26, through 6:00 PM Saturday August 17.
- Catches have been higher than expected in the fishery and 67 fish were landed between July 26 and August 4. Catches are detailed in the box below.
