

## WAC 220-415-080 2019-2020 Spring black bear special permits

 Summary: Outlines the requirements related to participating in spring special permit hunts for black bear; successful harvest applies towards the annual 2 bear bag limit.




## **Black Bear Management Units**



- Changes: Adjust season dates to reflect 2020 season and adjust the title to 220-415-080 2020 Spring black bear special permits.
- Changes: Remove Kapowsin hunt area. -150 permits









October 18-19, 2019 WDFW Commission Meeting Presentation

- Changes: Technical edit to list GMU 648 prior to GMU 638 under the Copalis Hunt Area to clarify that GMU 638 is where the U.S. Forest Service lands are excluded.
- Rationale: Correctly identify season dates and locations.





Information is subject to changes and amendments over time.

- Changes: Added language to adjust the numbers of permits offered in:
  - Blue Creek, GMU 154 from 15 to 18 permits +3
  - Dayton, GMU 162
    from 15 to 18 permits +3
  - Wenaha, GMU 169 from 45 to 60 permits +15
  - Mt. View, GMU 172 from 15 to 24 permits +9
  - Lick Creek, GMU 175 from 15 to 18 permits +3
- Changes: Added a Peola hunt area, GMU 178 with 5 permits +5


- Rationale: 38 additional permits to distribute hunters in areas where ungulate survival is of concern.
  - Intended to have hunters focus on bears in elk calving areas, which may be beneficial to early elk calf survival.
  - Based on the 5-year average harvest rate/permit/GMU expect approximately 7 additional bears harvested under the special permit hunt.
    - An increase in permits is not expected to negatively affect bear populations or stability in the area.

## Proposed Spring Special Permit Black Bear Hunt Areas 2020



 Changes: Added language to include a mandatory reporting of harvest within 72 hours of kill and mandatory pelt check, with evidence of sex, for sealing within five days of notification of kill.



- Rationale continued: Pelt sealing is expected to:
  - a) improve harvest reporting,
  - b) improve the quality of the harvest data, and
  - c) provide a better understanding of the sex and age classes harvested during the spring special permits



 Rationale: Pelt sealing, with evidence of sex, will allow the department to monitor the number and reproductive status of female bears harvested; which will improve the decision-making for future spring bear permit seasons.





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## **Public Comments**

- 139 comments received
  - (138 online and 1 letter)
  - 42 Support
    - General support;
      - 18 provided additional comment: 5 oppose pelt seal, 13 expressed interest in more opportunity, other areas, and dissatisfaction for loss of Kapowsin hunt area
  - 11 Neutral
  - 66 Opposed
    - Reasons provided: oppose mandatory pelt check, loss of opportunity on west side, potential for orphaning cubs, potential to lose hunters, request for outreach on salvaging harvested meat.
