Timeline and Public Involvement

August 23 Petition accepted by Commission Action

Sept. 3 CR 102 (Proposal Rulemaking) filed

Sept. – Oct. Proposal posted to website for public

comment

Sept. 24 Regional public meeting

October 18-19 Briefing and Public Hearing

November 1 Commission decision

Rules will take effect 31 days after filing

Current Green (Duwamish) River Section rule

- Section was closed to fishing in past years.
- Municipal Watershed was changed from "closed" to "open" for fishing during the rule simplification process.
- Public access within the municipal watershed is currently prohibited and anglers cannot legally walk to any part of the Green River that flows through the municipal watershed.


Petition Process

Commission Petition Presentation August 2019

- Close to fishing the section of the Green (Duwamish)
 River from the Tacoma Municipal Watershed
 Boundary Marker (approximately 1.3 miles
 downstream of the Tacoma Headworks Dam) to the
 Friday Creek confluence.
- Staff recommended the petition be accepted and to initiate rule making.

Rule Change Proposal

Green (Duwamish) river (King County): from Tacoma Municipal Watershed Boundary Marker (1.3 miles downstream to Tacoma Headworks dam) to Friday Creek: Closed Waters.
