# OUTREACH

## **Communications plan executive summary:**

Draft strategic communications plan to guide statewide cougar safety outreach at the community level. The plan's goals include:

- Increase public's awareness of how to be safe in cougar country
- Protection of property so that the cougar complaint rate is steady or declining
- Increase understanding of cougar ecology, behavior, safety awareness, and coexistence in cougar country
- The team will work with key partners to bring customized communications that fit the needs of each community.



# **OUTREACH: TOOLS AND VENUES**

- Provide county specific data to elected officials and enforcement (Fall, 2020)
- Increase trust through information and sharing of concerns


