- ► Policy environment for riparian protection and enhancement Governor's Office, legislative, other






Shrub Steppe Habitat

- Increasing pressures on remaining habitat
- What guidance are we providing to staff right now?
- Does science indicate burned areas still have habitat value?
- What science already exists to help us understand the effects of solar infrastructure and operations?
- ► How are we coordinating with others to help solar move forward and conserve fish and wildlife resources?

Puget Sound Nearshore Habitat

Estuary and Salmon Restoration Program (ESRP) biennial project list submitted via RCO to the Governor's Office

- \$20M list in total
- Restoration and protection projects
 ~70-80% of funding
- Small grants ~ \$500k
- Learning projects ~10% of funding
- Shore Friendly Programs ~\$2M
