Columbia River and Tributary Fishery Reports

Fishery Reports:

Mainstem Columbia River

Salmon/Steelhead:

Sec 1 (Bonneville) – 197 bank anglers kept 10 Chinook and released one Chinook. 6 boats/12 rods kept two Chinook and released one Chinook.

Sec 2 (Camas/Washougal) – 17 boats/38 rods kept two Chinook and released one Chinook.

Sec 3 (I-5 area) – 15 boats/21 rods had no catch.

Sec 4 (Vancouver) – 40 bank anglers kept two Chinook. 111 boats/230 rods kept 19 Chinook and released two Chinook.

Sec 5 (Woodland) – 28 bank anglers had no catch. 96 boats/289 rods kept 20 Chinook and released 3 Chinook.

Sec 6 (Kalama) – 55 bank anglers kept two Chinook and one steelhead. 99 boats/255 rods kept 26 Chinook and released one Chinook.

Sec 7 (Cowlitz) – 22 boats/67 rods kept seven Chinook.

Sec 8 (Longview) – 110 bank anglers kept two steelhead. 238 boats/482 rods kept 26 Chinook and released five Chinook.

Sec 9 (Cathlamet) – 19 bank anglers had no catch. 12 boats/32 rods kept one Chinook.

Sec 10 (Cathlamet) – Three bank anglers had no catch. 149 boats/377 rods kept 61 Chinook, three jacks and released two Chinook, one jack and one steelhead.

Sturgeon:

Sec 8 (Longview) – Two bank anglers had no catch.

John Day Pool – 6 boats/16 rods released two oversized sturgeon.

Walleye:

Sec 2 (Camas/Washougal) – 1 boat/1 rod had no catch.

John Day Pool – 68 boats/164 rods kept 179 walleye and released 67 walleye.

Bass:

John Day Pool – 13 boats/25 rods kept 14 bass and released 152 bass.

Columbia River Tributaries

Salmon/Steelhead:

Cowlitz River – I-5 Br downstream – 107 bank rods kept four steelhead and released two steelhead. 2 boats/5 rods had no catch.

Above the I-5 Br – 31 bank rods kept seven steelhead. 22 boats/82 rods kept 40 steelhead and released one Chinook.

Lewis River – Three bank anglers had no catch.
