Downstream boundary – From a point on the Washingt shore projected through Dolphin Marker J (near Shipping Terminal 9), southe across the Columbia River to Columbia Park Boat Ramp in Rainier, Orego Upstream boundary – From a point on the Washington shore projected through Cottonwood Island Dike Light "31", southerly across the Columbia River to deadline marker on the Oregon shore.	
Daily Bag Limit:	Two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead) per day, but only one may be a Chinook and only one may be a steelhead. All other permanent regulations apply.

Season:	Saturday June 5 through Sunday June 6	2 retention days
Area:	Tower Island power lines (approximately six miles below The Dalles Dam) upstream to Oregon/Washington border, plus the Oregon and Washington banks between Bonneville Dam and the Tower Island power lines.	
Daily Bag Limit:	Two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead) per day, but only one may be a Chinook and only one may be a steelhead. All other permanent regulations apply.
