Puget Sound is the nation's second largest estuary with approximately **2,500 miles of shorelines**, over **800 unique coastal bays and inlets**, and **16 major river deltas**, collectively comprising what is called the nearshore.



- 3. Restore ecosystems for Chinook salmon & Southern Resident killer whales

- 5. Collaborate with tribes and partners to support locally-developed projects
- 6. Bring in funding and technical support from NOAA and EPA to leverage our investments
