# Periodic Status Review Process and Timeline Listing Process Guided by WAC 220-610-110

- Periodic Status Review is not a management document, but provides current information and recommendation on the <u>status</u> of the species.
- Final Periodic Status Review 5 years post delisting last Steller Sea Lion in 2015, recommended delisting.
- February 2020 solicit data and information from the public and work on initial draft.
- April 2021 90 public comment period on draft
- Listing "...solely on the basis of the biological status of the species being considered, based on the preponderance of scientific data available."
- Final WAC guided step for a recovered species.

1993 – listed as threatened

1997 – division of Distinct Population Segments (DPS)


2013 – Eastern DPS federally delisted; delisted in WA in 2015





SAR non-pup counts = +9.12Scordino and Allyn (2020) = +7.9WA rookery complex




