- Mid November: Finalize management plans with Co-Managers
- Late November: Agreed to Co-Manager Fishing Plans
- **December 1:** Announce coastal winter Steelhead fishing rules.

November-News release announcing Town Hall #2

- November Town Hall #2: Final Pre-season planning
 - o Initial staff recommendations for season dates, area, and regulatory options
 - o Stakeholder questions, feedback, and analysis of public proposals
 - o Review of pre-season schedule
- November Special Fish Committee Meeting Placeholder (post Town Hall #2): Briefing
- Mid November: Finalize Management Plans with tribal Co-Managers.

November-News release announcing Town Hall #3
