




WACs: 220-415-070 2021 Moose seasons, permit quotas, and areas. 220-415-120 2021 Bighorn sheep seasons, permit quotas, and areas. 220-415-130 2021 Mountain goat seasons, permit quotas, and areas.

Moose

- Primarily occur in NE and northcentral Washington
- Most recent estimate (2016) is ~5,000 moose in the NE
- DFW attempts regional surveys to estimate age and sex ratios (snow dependent)
- Recent research in NE WA indicated populations were declining (2014-2018; GMUs 117/124)
- Substantial reduction in antlerless permits in 2018







WAC 220-415-070 Moose seasons, permit quotas, and areas

- 1. Exclude Parker Lake from the "49 Degrees North" hunt area
 - Large-scale timber treatment in Parker Lake area that will reduce hunt quality (once-in-a-lifetime hunt). Exclusion will cease with timber operations.
- 2. Include GMU 139 in the "Hangman" and "Cheney B" hunts
 - Expanded moose distribution warrants inclusion, also assists with occasional human-moose conflict.




Mountain goat

- Most recent range-wide estimate was 2,400-3,200 goats (2008)
- DFW attempts surveys every other year in most areas

Hunting guidelines:

- Populations must have >100 goats for a hunt to occur
- Total harvest should be ≤4% of the estimated population that is >1 year old
- Nanny harvest should not exceed 1.2% of the estimated nanny population






WAC 220-415-130 Mountain goat seasons, permit quotas, and areas

- 1. Suspension of the "Conflict reduction" special permits (Olympic Peninsula)
 - Three "East Olympic Mtns" hunts affected (5, 10, & 10 permits)
 - Hunts were in conjunction with ongoing depopulation efforts on the Peninsula
 - Very few, if any, animals are expected to remain in the hunt areas post-summer 2022
 - Permits may be re-proposed in future years if need arises in the future



WAC 220-415-130 Mountain goat seasons, permit quotas, and areas

- 1. Reduce the "Goat Rocks East" hunt from 2 permits to 1
- 2. Recommended adjustment: reduce the "North Lake Chelan" hunt permits from 2 to 1 Mountain Goat Abundance, North Shore Lake Chelan (2012 - 2021)





Bighorn sheep

- 17 populations (herds)
- Monitoring varies with local conditions and resources
- DFW attempts annual surveys for most herds
- Most recent estimates indicate ~1,500 bighorn sheep
- Pneumonia, caused by bacteria Mycoplasma ovipneumoniae is greatest management issue
 - 5 currently affected by *M. ovi*
 - 4 previously affected by *M. ovi*





WAC 220-415-120 Bighorn sheep seasons, permit quotas, and areas

- 1. Reduce "Any Ram" permits in Selah Butte, Umtanum, Cleman Mtn, and Quilomene hunts
- 2. Eliminate Selah Butte and Umtanum "adult ewe," "juvenile ram," and "youth" permits
- 3. Suspend the Vulcan Mtn "Any Ram" hunt
- 4. Include GMU 186 and portions of 181 in the Mountain View – Black Butte "Any Ram" hunt area
