



Public comments

Common themes:

- General support for proposed changes
- General disagreement with proposed changes
- Request to engage non-profit or other groups to assist with elk area fencing
- Request to allow landowners to receive tags and address conflict near elk areas
- Request to prevent private landowner tags
- Desire to allowing public access on private lands to address damage
- Concern over private landowners dictating ungulate management

GMAC input: 100% agree with proposed changes



Elk General Seasons – WAC 220-415-050 Proposed changes

- Modify elk eastern Washington archery early and late seasons in GMU 382 to exclude Deer Area 5382
 - This change eliminates overlap between elk general season hunters and deer special permit hunters in Deer Area 5382
 - Ensures hunt quality for deer special permit holders



Public comments

Common themes:

- General agreement with proposed changes
- General disagreement with proposed changes
- Dislike of spike/true spike (antler point restriction) regulations
- Desire to have elk hunting by draw only
- Concern over impact of predators
- Concern regarding tribal hunting
- Requests to expand archery season
- Requests to allow crossbow in archery
- Request for more muzzleloader seasons
- Desire for more late seasons
- Concern over land access
- Request to improve hunt quality

GMAC input: 100% agree with proposed changes



Elk Special Permits – WAC 220-415-060 Proposed changes

- 1. Adjust hunt dates to align with calendar year
- 2. Adjust permit levels to balance opportunity with population characteristics (e.g., abundance)
 - Reduction of antlerless permits in Mount St Helens herd area
 - Reduction of permit levels in the Blue Mountains elk herd area
 - Increase of antlerless permits in the Yakima elk herd area
- 3. Elimination of the Mt. Adams, Carlton and West Goat Rocks "Quality" special permit hunts
- 4. Creation of hoof disease "incentive" permits
- 5. Recommended changes:
 - Some special permits in the "Quality" and "Bull" category are set by an allocation formula (32 affected hunts)
 - Adjustment of "Green River" special permit hunts
 - Adjustment of hunt dates to reflect 2022 license year (3 affected hunts)



Public comments

Common themes:

- General support for proposed changes
- General disagreement with proposed changes
- Mention of antler point restrictions (e.g., spike only regulation)
- Dislike of permit reductions
- Concern over tribal hunting
- Concern over predation impacts to ungulate populations
- Request for date or season changes on specific hunts
- Request for antierless hunting by special permit only
- Request for increased antlerless opportunities
- Concern over lost opportunity
- Preference for adjusting permit dates rather than eliminate permits
- Desire to go to special permit (draw only) seasons
- Support for disease management
