Background summary:

In June 2022 department staff briefed the Commission on a proposed rule-making which will add a new section to Washington Administration Code (WAC), WAC 220-351-100 Commercial Fisheries Permits/licensing. This rule making proposes to allow four unspecified commercial crewmember licenses instead of the current allowance (of two) which can be held by a commercial fishing license holder for specific fishing licenses. This proposed amendment would not apply to non-salmon landing licensees fishing for albacore tuna.

Large fishing vessels often have four or more crew-members on board in order to safely operate and need to replace crewmembers during the fishing season. The proposed rule would provide flexibility to a commercial license holder to rotate crewmembers on larger vessels during the season.

Staff recommendation:

Adopt rule as proposed in the CR102.

Policy issue(s) and expected outcome:

The proposed rule would increase the number of unspecified crew-member licenses the holder of a commercial fishing license can obtain to four.

Fiscal impacts of agency implementation:

na

Public involvement process used and what you learned:

Commercial Fishing License holders were queried during various meetings hosted by the Department as well as by email during the past year. Responses were supportive of an increase from the current two to a total of four unspecified crew-member licenses.

The public was notified via WDFW website and in Washington State Register. Three comments were received during the comment period which ran from March 22, 2022 through Jun 28, 2022.

One commentor testified during the June Commission meeting.

Action requested and/or proposed next steps:

Consider adoption of proposed rule.

I move that the Commission adopt the proposed rule as presented in the CR102.

Consistent with RCW 77.65.610 (3)(a), commercial fishing license holders, except for non-salmon landing licensees fishing for albacore tuna, may obtain a total of four crewmember licenses for use by individuals working on the vessel named in the commercial fishing license if the individuals are not prohibited from obtaining a crewmember license under RCW 77.65.610.
