Background summary:

Item 1:

Proposed Acquisition of 60(+/-) acres in Grant County Flat Lake Property/Quincy Lakes Unit, Columbia Basin Wildlife Area, Region 2

This proposal is to acquire two parcels totaling 60(+/-) acres within the Quincy Lakes Unit of the Columbia Basin Wildlife Area in Grant County. The properties are important for waterfowl and other wetland obligate species and acquisition will provide better wildlife and wetland monitoring and management. The site also provides recreational hunting, fishing, and wildlife viewing.

Approved through Lands 20/20 in 2019, the appraised value of the property is \$130,000, which will be provided using funds from the limited fish and wildlife account through the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife Migratory Bird Stamp & Art Print Program.

Items 2 & 3:

Proposed Acquisitions in Methow Wildlife Area, Okanogan County, Region 2 East Property, 21(+/-)-acre addition to Rendezvous Unit, Methow Wildlife Area West Property, 200(+/-)-acre addition to Big Valley Unit, Methow Wildlife Area

These proposed acquisitions will conserve a 21(+/-)-acre property on the east side (Rendezvous Unit), as well as a 200(+/-)-acre property the west side (Big Valley Unit) of the Methow Wildlife Area in Okanogan County. Acquisition of these properties will protect critical habitat of state imperiled Inter-mountain Basins Big Sagebrush Steppe and Ponderosa Pine Woodland, Savanna Ecological Systems, and a crucial mule deer migration corridor, and support a broad spectrum of species including western gray squirrel, gray wolf, fisher, golden eagle, prairie falcon, Lewis' woodpecker, and piliated woodpecker. These properties also provide recreational hunting, hiking and wildlife viewing.

These properties were approved through Lands 20/20 in 2019, the appraised values are \$150,000 for the east property and \$920,000 for the west property. Funds will be provided through the Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO), Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP), in a combined 2020 Critical Habitat grant.

Item 4:

Proposed Fee-Title Acquisition of 1,070(+/-) acres & Proposed Conservation Easement Acquisition of 17(+/-) acres in Yakima County

Wenas/Cleman Mountain Property, Wenas Unit, Wenas Wildlife Area, Region 3

This proposal is to acquire 1,070(+/-) acres in fee title and an additional 17(+/-) acres in conservation easement in the Wenas Unit of the Wenas Wildlife Area in Yakima County. The Wenas/Cleman Mountain property borders the wildlife area on two sides and functions as a connection to important shrubbsteppe core habitat and stream corridors. The property benefits a diverse array of avian, terrestrial, and aquatic species. The fee-title property will provide recreation by way of hiking, wildlife and bird viewing, biking, horseback riding, fishing, and hunting.

Approved through Lands 20/20 in 2019, the appraised value of the fee-title property is \$1,151,000 and the appraised value of the conservation easement has yet to be determined. Funds will be provided through the Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO), Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program (WWRP), Critical Habitat grant.

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Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommend approval of these land transactions.
