Background summary:

Department staff are seeking a decision on the Status Report and recommendation to list the Cascade Red Fox as Threatened in WA. Currently the Cascade Red Fox has no special status as either an Endangered, Threatened, or Sensitive species.

Staff recommendation:

Recommend adoption of the rule as presented by Department staff.

Policy issue(s) and expected outcome:

This is a new listing which will result in the species being prioritized for conservation actions in the future. It will also trigger the Periodic Status Review process as defined in WAC 220-610-110 which includes drafting and presenting a Periodic Status Review to the commission every five years and the drafting of a recovery plan for Cascade Red Fox.

Fiscal impacts of agency implementation:

Resources will be pointed towards the drafting of a recovery plan and the Periodic Status Review process as well as directly working on recovery and monitoring of the species.

Public involvement process used and what you learned:

The Status Report was reviewed by Department staff and external species experts before a 90-day public comment periods on the document and our findings. There were nine responses to the 90-day public comment period on the Status Report: three clearly support our recommendation to list the Cascade Red Fox as a Threatened Species. Three expressed the need for protection of Cascade Red Foxes through greater predator controls. One reported a Red Fox sighting. One described a decline in seeing Cascade Red Foxes over the years. One expressed a doubt in the Status Report due to seeing red foxes over the years in northeast Oregon.

Recommend adoption of the rule as presented by Department staff.

Summary of Public Comments Received During the Official Comment Period and WDFW Response:

Cascade Red Fox

Written Supporting Comments:

Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) received zero comments through our online survey.

3 individuals emailed with strong support for listing as threatened

3 individuals emailed with support for protection of Cascade Red Foxes via predator control efforts.

Written Opposing, Neutral, and Other Comments:

Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) received zero comments through our online survey.

Dave Werntz, M.S. representing WDFW Wildlife Diversity Advisory Council submitted a letter to Department staff. "We believe an endangered status for Cascade red fox is the appropriate and correct designation and recommend Cascade red fox be designated an endangered species in Washington. We also recommend immediate recovery planning and actions to protect Cascade red fox.

1 individual reported observation of a fox

1 individual regularly sees foxes in Oregon.

1 individual reported the used to regularly see red foxes but haven't for many years.

Fish and Wildlife Commission Hearing, Public Comments:

Denis DeSilvis representing WDAC, spoke during the commission meeting and recommends the Cascade Red Fox be classified as endangered.

One individual called in and recommended an Endangered status and a focus on conservation of the ecosystem.

Another individual called in and supported a recommendation of threatened or endangered.

Rationale-Agency Action Regarding Comments:

There were zero comments opposing listing the Red fox. There were two comments supporting an endangered status instead of threatened. There is significant conservation concern around Cascade red fox, however there is still uncertainty around the potential threats to the species. The extremely low effective conservation size necessitates listing and protection, given the uncertainty we feel the species better fits the definition for threatened: likely to become an endangered species within the foreseeable future throughout a significant portion of its range within the state without

cooperative management or removal of threats.” For that reason, Department staff will recommend moving forward with this rule change.

Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The purpose of the proposed amendments to WAC 220-200-100 if adopted, would classify the Cascade red fox as “threatened” in the state of Washington and reclassify the white pelican from “threatened” to “sensitive”.

If the proposed amendments are adopted by the Commission, the Cascade red fox would be classified as threatened and the American white pelican would be downlisted to “sensitive”. The proposed amendments, if approved, would include the additional regulation and enforcement of wildlife classified as threatened identified in RCW 77.15.120. WDFW would also initiate work on a recovery plan for the species according to WAC 220-610-110.

Reasons supporting proposal: The Cascade red fox (*Vulpes vulpes cascadenensis*) is a subspecies of red fox that historically occurred in subalpine meadow, parkland, upper montane forest, and alpine habitats of the Cascade Range of Washington and southern British Columbia. Lack of detections of Cascade red foxes in British Columbia in recent decades indicate that this species is now restricted to Washington. A southward range contraction appears to have occurred within Washington within recent decades, as the only known population now occurs in the South Cascades (south of the I-90 corridor). It now occurs within ≤ 50% of its historical range in the state.

The western population of white pelicans has recovered substantially and given the size of the Badger Island colony and number of non-breeding white pelicans in Washington during the past several years, a change in listing could be considered. The species remains somewhat vulnerable, however, as only the single colony regularly forms in Washington, and white pelican colonies are highly sensitive to disturbances; adults will desert and/or leave eggs and young exposed to predation following disturbances. We recommend the species be down-listed to Sensitive. A Sensitive species is, “vulnerable or declining and is likely to become endangered or threatened in a significant portion of its range within the state without cooperative management or removal of threats” (WAC 220-610-110).
