

Please note that there are black boxes (redactions) on various pages of the responsive documents. The black box may be small or large depending on the amount of information that is redacted. There may also be multiple redactions on one page. Within the redaction is a white code – for example, [1a] [1b], etc. That code designates the statutory exemption applicable to the redacted information. If there is only one code on the page, but there are numerous redactions, that one statutory exemption applies to all of the redactions on that page. Otherwise, the code printed within the redaction designates the exemption for that redaction.

Also provided with these records is a key to the codes. This key identifies the statutory basis for the exemption as well as a brief explanation for why the exemption applies to the redacted information. As you review these responsive documents, you can refer to the key to identify the exemption and its applicability.

We have attempted to apply consistent redactions on document that contain the same information. In the event you locate documents that contain redactions that are not applied consistently, please let us know.
