Multiple Season Impacts to Harvest

- Summary:
- Crowding does not seem to be very significant
- Harvest rates of multi-season hunters are manageable
- Continue to monitor the results by the District Biologists
 - Recommend changes as appropriate


Recommendation

- Increase the number of permits drawn to 8500 for deer and 1250 for elk
- This should result in sales of 4600 deer permits and 1000 elk permits
- Continue to work with the Governor's office and the Legislature to authorize the expenditure of new money to fund the expansion of Wildlife Conflict Specialists and free up Officers to enforce the fish and game laws



Season History

- 1983 a few archery only areas, but limited special seasons for archers & muzzleloaders
- 1984 created archery and muzzleloader deer & elk seasons
- 1989 we initiated the choose your weapon restriction

- 1990's added more and more GMUs for both archers and muzzleloader hunters
- 2011 currently

 seasons in the
 majority of GMUs for
 both archery and
 muzzleloader hunters
