- Parcel(s) confirmation
- Administrative Review
- Appraisal
- Negotiation and Option
- Due Diligence
- Fish and Wildlife Commission Approval *
- Close



Acquisition Implementation Appraisal

- Appraisal Required by RCW 8.26.180
 - "(2) Real property shall be appraised before the initiation of negotiations ..."
 - "(3) The acquiring agency shall provide the owner of real property to be acquired with a written statement of ... the amount it established as just compensation."



Acquisition Implementation **Appraisal**

- **Appraisal Standards**
 - Determined by funding source
 - State funds require the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice, referred to a USPAP
 - Federal funds require Uniform Standards for Federal Land Acquisition, referred to as "yellow book"




Acquisition Implementation Appraisal


- Independent Fee Appraisers
 - 43 firms under contract
 - Firms selected based on knowledge in an area or property type
- Appraisal Review
 - Reviewed for compliance with appraisal standards
 - WDFW Chief Appraiser Shawn Kyes, MAI
 - Federal funds also require federal review
- Just Compensation Established Negotiations Begin



WDFW Lands 20/20



- Okanogan-Similkameen Watershed Project
- Riparian, shrub-steppe and forest habitat
- Secure migratory corridors for carnivores and their prey base
- Properties border Loomis State Forest



- J. Juelson property 40 acres
- T & M Juelson property 160 acres
- Borders Loomis State Forest
- Mule Deer and Big Horn Sheep



- Conservation Easements funded by US Fish and Wildlife Service and Recreation and Conservation Office
- Estimated annual O&M \$1,000 for easement monitoring

- Protect high quality wetlands
 - salt marsh
 - forested wetlands
 - freshwater wetlands
 - riparian areas
- Expand Existing Conservation Areas
- Marbled Murrelet





- Acquired by Forterra with USFWS grant
- Forterra provided matching funds
- Managed as a unit of the Johns River Wildlife Area
- O&M estimate of \$19,200 annually
