Rationale for Policy Review

- Policy C-3610 was adopted in 2000 for a minimum of five years;
- Policy C-3008 is specific to Hood Canal;
- Merge policy C-3008 and C-3610 into a single policy;
- Requested by recreational fishery constituents at previous commission meetings;
- Adhering to regional allocation targets in policy C-3610 is difficult due to increase in recreational effort.

Schedule and Process for Updating Policy C-3610 and C-3008

June- July 2012:

- Commission briefing: Puget Sound shrimp fishery and policy implementation;
- Recreational and commercial shrimp advisory groups formed;
- Commission briefing: proposed schedule for reviewing shrimp policies;
- Fish Committee discussion on potential management options for public and advisory group review and input.

August 2012

- Commission scoping session and selection of management options for initial review by advisory groups;
- Fish Committee discussion on modifications to policy language and management options based on input from advisory groups.

September, October, November 2012:


Three Commission meetings scheduled for public comment and staff analysis on management options and draft policy language.

December 2012

Commission action on policy revisions.

Conservation and Fishery Management

- Puget Sound sub-divided into six management regions
- Annual State-Tribal harvest management agreements
- Fishery closure during egg bearing period (October-April)
- Minimum pot mesh size protects small spot shrimp to allow for spawning
- Annual fishery quotas
- Fishery quotas are evaluated and adjusted annually using log book information and test fishery data




Time, area, and depth restrictions for non-spot fishery

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State Fishery Spot Shrimp Quotas by Management Region

- Total 2012 Puget Sound quota: 260,500 pounds
- Regions 3 and 5 contain 67% percent of the quota
- 2012, 57% of commercial harvest from Region 3
- 2012, 66% recreational harvest from Region 5



Preliminary Management Options for the State Spot Shrimp Fishery

- Five preliminary options developed by staff and Commission Fish Committee;
- Each option has a general allocation objective for all Puget Sound regions combined and allocation guidelines for each region;
- Option 1 reflects the current policy allocation objective, i.e. status quo;
- Option 2,3,4,and 5;
 - Increases recreational harvest in Regions 2,4,and 6
 - Decreases recreational harvest in Region 3
 - Allow for limited commercial harvest in Regions 2,4,5,and 6
- Additional options may be developed by advisory groups and will be presented at future commission meetings.

Summary of Management Options

Option 1 status quo

Option 2 and 4

- Provides 60% of the state quota to the recreational fishery
- Option 2: 80 spot shrimp daily limit
- Option 4: 60 spot shrimp daily limit

Option 3 and 5

- Provides 70% of the state quota to the recreational fishery
- Option 3: 80 spot shrimp daily limit
- Option 5: 60 spot shrimp daily limit

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Projecting the Recreational Spot Shrimp Harvest Days for Preliminary Management Options

- Projections are based on 2012 fishery quotas;
- Recreational effort remains constant;
- > Harvest days for 60 shrimp daily limit were generated using 2012 fishery catch data
