

Challenges to Improving Chehalis Fisheries

Chehalis Fall Chinook

- Primarily Wild Stock
 - ~8% return of hatchery origin
- Degraded Habitat
 - ~68% reduction in production potential
- Substantial Harvest in Alaska & Canada
 - 48% harvest rate in northern fisheries
 - Limited harvest for Washington

Primary Objectives of Policy

- Enhance Conservation Focus
 - Technical Rigor
 - In-Season Management
 - Monitoring and Enforcement
- Restore and Maintain Public Trust
 - Communication, Transparency, Accountability

What were the major points of public comment?

- 41 written comments
- 18 public testimony (December meeting)
- Summarized into 10 categories

Categories of Public Comment

- 28 Allocation
- 27 Conservation
- 15 Communication/Transparency
- 13 Economic Value
- 8 Enforcement/Accountability
- 6 Data Rigor
- 4 Limit Effort
- 4 Hatcheries
- 3 Alternative Fishing Practices
- 2 Misc.

Enhance Conservation Focus

- Make Conservation #1 priority
- Don't allocate to last fish
- Require in-season management
- Close fisheries if needed to restore runs
- Address habitat needs
- Reduce pre-terminal interceptions

Restore & Maintain Public Trust

Communication

- Improve communications -public trust is lost
- Increase public involvement
- Improve co-management

Transparency

- Clarify plan
- Explain Chehalis tribal harvest and share

Accountability

- Include measurable metrics for performance
- Document catch sharing

- Support science driven allocation not public opinion
- Support Commercial Fishery Option
 - Provide fish to all Washington residents
 - Increase harvest on abundant stocks
 - Recreational opportunities exist elsewhere
 - Initiate license buy-back to enhance economic viability

- Support Recreational Fishery Option
 - Significant economic value of sport fishery
 - Tribes provide fish for commercial market
 - Negative impacts of gillnets
 - Management costs of commercial fishery exceed economic value
- Support Upper River Recreational Fisheries

- Support 4-3 Proposal
 - Enhance recreational opportunity
 - Protect run components conservation tool

How could the draft policy be improved?

- Identify additional communication tools
 - Grays Harbor web page
 - Collaborative workshops with stakeholders
- Strengthen conservation guidance
 - Include explicit precautionary management
- Consider provisions to promote orderly fisheries and limit gear conflict
- Refine options for sharing

Process and Next Steps

- Dec Commission reviewed draft Policy
 - Initial public comment
 - Initiated 30-day public comment period
- Jan Commission reviews public comments
 - Additional public comment
 - Commission provides additional direction on Policy
- Feb Commission considers adoption of Policy
