Summary

Agenda item: Puget Sound Recreational Clam and Oyster Season Changes

Presenter(s): Rich Childers, Puget sound shellfish Manager, Fish Program

Background summary:

Changes to the recreational clam and oyster seasons on Puget Sound public beaches are recommended annually in order to maximize recreational opportunity while preventing overharvest of the state shares. Season changes are recommended based on the results of annual clam and oyster population surveys, expected recreational effort, and the frequency of low tides. For 2014, staff are recommending clam and oyster season changes to 20 public beaches. Of the 20 proposed changes, five beaches will have longer seasons compared to 2013, six will have shorter seasons, three beaches will have their opening dates shifted, five beaches will be opened due to improvements in water quality, and one beach is being closed in compliance with Bainbridge Island municipal codes. Specific changes for each of the 20 beaches are attached.
