


RFEG's are currently working on a sustainable funding plan to possibly fill the gap


- Without our federal funds RFEG capacity is greatly reduced




# RFEG Economic Engine:

- ➤ 112 professional and construction services (engineers, surveyors, scientists, etc)


### **Construction Services on Average:**


- ➤ \$6 million per year (on-the-ground dollars)



- South Puget Sound Salmon Enhancement Group's ongoing education project
- Regions Premier Chum Spawning Viewing Trail
- Partnership with Taylor Shellfish Farms since 1999
- 2,500 Student visitors each November (mid week)
- 2,000 Citizen visitors (weekends)
- 40-50 Volunteer Trail Guides donate over 700 hours per year
- 2009 National Geographic Traveler Magazine
- 20,000 to 70,000 Chum per year!



- Puget Sound, Watershed Ecology, Civic Engagement
- Key focus on regulations and role of agencies, tribes
- Focus on Puget Sound recovery
- Available to members of all 12 PS counties
- Funded thru May 2015 by \$250,000 Puget Sound Partnership grant
- NSEA manages, 6 other Puget Sound RFEGs subcontractors
- Evaluation process/adaptive management
- Goal is "HOW" to engage, not "WHAT" to say
