Background

Revisions to coastal commercial Dungeness crab regulations are need to:



- Improve the intent and enforceability of existing regulations
- Allow for a consistent season opening with Oregon
- Minimize lost or derelict crab gear
- Improve safety for the coastal Dungeness crab fishery

Streamline Season Opening Date WAC 220-52-045



- Current rule language is specific to a December 1 season opening date
- The season is often delayed due to state tribal harvest agreements or crab shell condition.

Modify Replacement Buoy Tag Program

WAC 220-52-042

- Recent investigations show system abuse
- Current eligibility for replacement tags is the first day of the season
- Proposal restricts eligibility to 15 days after the season opens
- Total number of replacement tags issued would be reduced from 15 percent to 10 percent

Modify Logbook Reporting Requirements



WAC 220-52-041

- Current regulations require crab caught in waters adjacent to WA coast, the Columbia River, Grays Harbor and Willapa Bay to be reported in a WA logbook.
- Crab caught off Oregon but landed into a WA port are not included
- As a result, as much as one million pounds of crab are not being reported on logbooks

Establish a Gear Tending Requirement WAC 220-52-045



- Currently no restriction on amount of time crab gear can be left in ocean without being fished
- Some gear is left in ocean unattended for months at a time while a fisher participates in other fisheries
- Proposed gear tending regulation requires gear to be fished every 21 days beginning May 1
- Reduces unlawful fishing of another's gear and the potential for becoming lost or derelict

Extend Pre-Season Gear Set Period

- Washington, Oregon and California coordinate coastal Dungeness crab management through the Tri-State Dungeness Crab Committee.
- The Committee agreed to revise the pre-season gear set period in Washington and Oregon from 64 hours to 73 hours prior to the season opening.
- Allow gear setting and gear retrieval to occur in daylight hours improving the enforceability of the season opening and improving safety.





- A public hearing will be held on November 25, 2014 at the Region Six headquarters in Montesano.
