## Background summary:

In April 2014 the Commission approved a three year rotating rule cycle where staff and public propose conservation and significant recreation rules that pertain to waters within the Columbia Basin the first year (2014), freshwaters of the Puget Sound and Coastal regions the second year (2015), and marine finfish, forage fish, and shellfish the third year (2016). The public was asked to submit rule proposals for the Columbia Basin during the month of May for the upcoming 2015-2016 sportfishing season(s). Proposals were posted online from August 12 through December 1 to receive written public comment.

## Policy issue(s) you are bringing to the Commission for consideration:

Establish rules and regulations for the upcoming 2015-16 sportfishing season(s) to ensure conservation of the fish and shellfish resource, and provide sustainable recreational fishing opportunities.

## Public involvement process used and what you learned:

A public news release, online notice through the department website, and an email to the regulation change email list in May notified people about the ability to submit rule proposals online. (Members of the public who were unable to submit proposals online were provided paper copies.)

A public news release, online notice through our website, and an email to our regulation change email list in mid-August notified people of the opportunity to comment on sportfishing regulation proposals. Further, an email was sent to each member of the public that submitted a proposal to notify them of the status of their proposal and the ability to comment online. Department staff provided explanations for proposals that we recommend for further consideration and for proposals that were not recommend for further consideration. The end date for submitting written comments was December 1, 2014. Members of the public who were unable to view or comment online were provided paper copies of the recommended proposals and a form for comments. The comment forms were entered online by WDFW staff.
In addition, public meetings (one per Columbia Basin region) were held to discuss the proposals and proposal process. One presentation was given to an advisor group.

This meeting is the public hearing for the 2015-16 proposals.

## Sportfishing Rule Change Proposals

This year the Commission adopted a three year process for sport rules. Under this process, proposals are considered for the Columbia River Basin the first year, 2014; proposals for the Puget Sound and Coastal freshwaters are considered the second year, 2015; and proposals for saltwater are considered the third year, 2016.

The department recommends 32 rule proposals for the Columbia River Basin. Five public meetings occurred as shown in the table below. Written public comments were due by December 1, 2014. Oral comments will be received at the Public Hearing portion of the Commission Meeting December 12-13, 2014. The written public comments are summarized below.

## \# 1. Technical changes

Type of Rule Change Proposal
Recreational

## Short Description

Corrects Washington Administrative Code language to reflect rule adoptions made by the Commission (technical changes). Formats the language in a clear structure and corrects mistakes in spelling, etc.

## Explanation

This proposal corrects errors in WAC language and is a technical fix to address these errors. This change is needed so that the WAC language matches the Commission's intent.

| 4 | Region 2 | Cougar Lake (Winthrop/ Okanogan counties) language clarification. Include selective gear rules in the Washington Administrative Code. This language was adopted as part of the catch and release rule but was inadvertently left out in the rule language. |

| 8 | Region 5 | Abernathy Creek language clarification for closed waters. Change to the following: Closed waters from posted markers 500 feet below Abernathy Fish Technology Center upstream to Abernathy Falls. |

| 10 | Region 5 | Molton Falls is spelled incorrectly and should be changed to "Moulton Falls" |

Support: Most comments support this proposal.
Oppose: No comments oppose this proposal.

## \# 2. Remove internal combustion motors prohibition on small streams

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Remove internal combustion motor prohibition rule from small streams in the Columbia River basin.

## Explanation

This change removes the internal combustion motor (ICM) prohibition from small rivers and creeks where the use of a floating device equipped with an ICM is impractical and would not be considered feasible. Removing these prohibitions will streamline fishing regulations from streams in the following counties:
Adams; Asotin; Clark; Columbia; Cowlitz; Garfield; Lewis; Skamania; Wahkiakum; Walla Walla; Whitman. Table (2). Streams and rivers affected by this proposal.

## Written Testimony ( 20 comments)

Support: Support for this proposal includes a statement that streamlining the regulations would be a welcome change. There was also a suggestion that the use of internal combustion motors while fishing only be allowed on rivers and small streams by people with disabilities.

Oppose: Opposing comments include: a) do not understand reason for this change based on the description; b) this could create conflict between anglers; people will find a way to use motors if the
restriction is removed; c) it is not obvious what benefit comes from removing this restriction. One person suggested "...Continue to specify which streams are open to power boats, and if you want to simplify things, specify that unless a stream is specifically open to motorized boating it is closed."

## \# 3. Black Friday trout opener <br> Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

Provide targeted holiday fishing opportunities on the Friday after Thanksgiving.

## Explanation

This proposal expands the "Black Friday" trout opener initiated in 2012 in southwest Washington (Region 5). List of lakes and proposed opening dates for Black Friday opener (Table 3) addresses the WDFW strategic initiative to increase freshwater license sales.

## Written Testimony ( 10 comments)

Support: All comments support this proposal. Suggestions include that this proposal be expanded to include more lakes throughout the state and for whitefish. There is also a request that this be done as long as wild species are protected and only planted stocks allowed to be harvested (retained).

Oppose: There are no opposing comments.

## \# 4. Tenkara fly fishing gear

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Modify the definition of "Fly Fishing only" waters to include Tenkara fly fishing gear.

## Explanation

Tenkara fly fishing uses a long limber rod with a braided Tenkara fly line permanently attached to the tip of the rod. Tenkara fly lines vary in length from 12 to 25 feet with an additional leader attached. This technique is gaining in popularity and is not legal to use under the current "fly fishing only" rules. It is disqualified from use because of the term "conventional fly line". Using the term Tenkara in the rule will clearly define the type of fly line is required to comply with the rule change.

## Written Testimony (79 comments)

Support: Most comments support this proposal and include: a) Tenkara is fly fishing in a minimal form; b) makes catching a fish more challenging; c) produces less stress to the fish; d) is physically easier to use
than conventional tackle. There was a request to allow nylon/ fluorocarbon line as well (known as "level" line in Tenkara). There was a suggestion that the definition of fly fishing be focused more on the fly and weight; for example "Fly fishing waters = Use of unbaited/unscented tied flies as lures only, with no additional weight attached to the line at any point."

Oppose: Opposing comments include: a) Tenkara style fishing is not compatible with normal USA fly fishing because it is "dappling" and would cause conflict with fly fishing; b) enforcement is stretched too thin to add minutiae to the rules; c) no change is needed because this method could be done with conventional fly fishing line as is currently stated in the rules and the current rules state nothing about the use of a reel.

## \# 5. Stream Strategy for the Columbia Basin Type of Rule Change Proposal Conservation

## Short Description

Closes all rivers, streams, and beaver ponds to fishing, except as listed in the Fishing in Washington Sportfishing Rules Pamphlet. Rivers, streams, and beaver ponds listed in the pamphlet as "open to fishing" will be identified for areas where stocks are robust and can support fishing pressure, as well as in areas where reasonable recreational opportunity exists.

## Explanation

With various fish populations across the state being listed under the Endangered Species Act, a more conservative approach to the regulation of fishing in rivers, streams, and beaver ponds is essential and requires WDFW to provide the appropriate level of protection to these populations, in particular rearing juvenile anadromous salmonids. The difficulty is how to provide protection for these stocks of fish while also offering reasonable recreational opportunity. Throughout the Columbia River basin, the standard stream rule opens rivers, streams, and beaver ponds to fishing for game fish from the first Saturday in June through October 31, with an 8" minimum size and two fish per day limit. Consequently, much of the juvenile rearing habitat for resident trout, as well as for anadromous salmon, steelhead, cutthroat, and Dolly Varden/bull trout, is currently open for fishing. As a result, juvenile anadromous salmonids are at risk of incidental catch and may not survive improper handling and release, especially if bait is used. A more conservative management strategy to protect these stocks is to close all rivers, streams, and beaver ponds to fishing, except as listed in the Fishing in Washington Sportfishing Rules Pamphlet. Rivers, streams, and beaver ponds listed in the pamphlet as "open to fishing" will be identified for areas where stocks are robust and can support fishing pressure, as well as in areas where reasonable recreational opportunity exists. The primary goal is to protect stocks at certain time of the year and in areas where they are most susceptible to mortality associated with recreational angling. This strategy has been successful in Puget Sound, the Strait of Juan de Fuca, and the Coast and now is being proposed for streams in the Columbia River basin. The tables and maps present the fishing opportunity that will be available in the Columbia basin. Areas open to fisheries are presented by river systems. All salmon seasons listed are last year's seasons and are subject to change. Since the basic rule in these areas would be "closed unless listed" there are "closed water" areas that will no longer be highlighted. Some of these closed areas are still listed in the tables to clarify the intent of the proposals. The last column in each table is a letter listing, from A-F. These are the reasons for the proposed changes. Rules that remain unchanged will not have a letter in this column. Descriptions of the A-F listing are shown in the Code Table.

## Written Testimony ( 107 total comments, 102 online plus 5 email)

Support: Examples of comments that support this proposal include: a) encourage WDFW to consider a total bait ban even in Code C areas as a means of preventing such areas from slipping to Code D or F areas; b) any river with wild steelhead should be catch and release for all resident trout; c) support this comprehensive regulation change to protect juvenile and adult salmonid populations, while still providing angling opportunity in areas not critical to juvenile rearing; d) the Okanogan River tributaries need more protection from the river to the barrier falls because these small streams provide the best chance for wild steelhead recruitment in the Okanogan system; e) extend the same status given to lower Bonaparte Creek to Loup Loup Creek, Johnson Creek, Tunk Creek, and Antoine Creek; f) Add bull trout to the ranking criteria because fishing and harassment can occur at times when these fish need energy for spawning; g) WDFW must enforce these new regulations.

Oppose: Examples of comments that oppose this proposal include: a) greater focus on production from hatchery systems would make these restrictions unnecessary; b) disagree with mandatory hatchery steelhead retention because do not want to drive a few hours to fish and then have to keep a mature (spawning or spawned out) hatchery steelhead; c) modify the proposal to allow the release of spawning or
spawned out steelhead; d) not being able to fish close to home waters where the water volume provides prime fishing is disappointing; e) request for catch and release only and/or fly only water; f) this approach destroyed small stream trout fishing in the high country of Puget Sound, where areas not accessible by anadromous fish were still cut off; g) this assumes only salmonids exist in the Columbia River and greatly restricts fishing opportunities; h) the regulations make a simple system complicated, make them selective gear or fly only; i) enforcement of this rule is a problem; j) prefer fewer hatchery fish be released into the Grande Ronde to lessen the impact on wild fish and maintain existing rule; $k$ ) if proposal to keep the hatchery fish on the lower Grand Ronde (county bridge to the mouth) is enacted, it will ruin the fishing for fly fishermen because gear and fly fishing are not compatible.

## \# 6. Statewide General Walleye Rules <br> Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

Change the statewide walleye rules to a minimum size of 12 inches and a daily limit of 8 fish.

## Explanation

Scientific data indicates that 12-21 inch walleye can support increasing angler exploitation. This rule will provide additional angling opportunity for walleye in many popular waters and simplify walleye fishing regulations.

## Written Testimony (19 comments)

Support: Comments in support of this proposal include: a) change the minimum length but not the daily limit; b) allow unlimited take because walleye are predators of listed fish and inhibit their recovery; c) simplifying rules where it meets conservation objectives is always a good idea and it would be nice to see the WDFW take this approach with other regulations.

Oppose: Comments opposing this proposal include: a) this is a regulation without science; b) the limits are already too liberal; c) it is time we learned to live with this species since we cannot eliminate it; d) suggest no bag limits, no minimum size restriction, and mandatory retention of all walleye; e) set the minimum length at 14 or 15 inches to provide enough meat for a meal.

## \# 7. Modify some year round lakes to a March 1 opener Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Change from year round to a March 1 to October 31 or December 31 open season with the exception of Powerline Lake. Powerline is a walk in lake, and has an end date of the first Sunday in October due to water fowl hunting and potential parking conflicts.

## Explanation

These small ponds offer limited fishing after October 31 into the late fall/winter months until they are restocked in late February or early March. Changing these waters to a March 1 opening day helps direct anglers to these waters when fishing is best. March 1 is when weather conditions often improve and the public is looking for outdoor opportunities. This has become the default opening day in SE WA ponds because of weather moderation and hatchery stocking schedules. Provides a consistent and promotable annual date when the lakes will be stocked and open to fishing for trout and other gamefish species. Anglers can schedule their fishing trip to the lake and include their friends and family. Spring planting dates
vary from year to year. Anglers with flexible schedules are able to target on lake plantings but most anglers do not have the ability to fish on the days fish are planted and so are not provided similar opportunity. Lakes are located in the following counties: Asotin; Franklin; Kittitas; Yakima; Walla Walla.

## Written Testimony ( 20 comments)

Support: Comments in support of this proposal include that a consistent threshold date for stocking is welcomed.

Oppose: Most comments oppose this proposal and include: a) there are already very few opportunities for ice fishing in the state; b) these are not natural lakes so this type of management is unnecessary; c) this change will take away the opportunity for families to enjoy the water during the winter months and there are already too many restrictions; d) this will make the lakes empty faster of fish and this will mean less opportunity in the summer months.

## Region 1

## \# 8. Snake River Sturgeon <br> Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Conservation

## Short Description

Closes harvest while maintaining catch and release fishing for sturgeon in the lower Snake River reservoirs, from Ice Harbor Dam upstream to the Oregon State border, including all tributaries of the Snake River above Ice Harbor Dam.

## Explanation

Limited stock assessments indicate that the sturgeon populations within these impoundments suffer from sporadic and limited natural production and that abundance may be declining or at least not rebuilding under the current fishery management (that allows for year-round retention). Eliminating retention will assist in rebuilding of these populations.

## Written Testimony ( 17 comments)

Support: Comments in support of this proposal agreed and this will allow the sturgeon population to recover and that it is a good change to allow catch and release only.

Oppose: Comments opposing this proposal include: a) before eliminate retention do a population study and work to eliminate poaching; b) close the season entirely for a few years so that the population can rebound and then open to catch and release for a few years to see how the sturgeon fare; c) fishermen do not affect the fishery with a two per year limit; d) increased regulations for the protection of these valuable fish has effectively shut down guiding opportunities; e) urge WDFW to seek other management and sustainable methods rather than closing one of the very few areas left for sturgeon retention.

## \# 9. Spring and Blue lakes year round season

## County or Location Information

Columbia Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Change from March 1-October 31 season to year-round to provide additional late fall opportunity

## Explanation

This proposal will provide additional recreational opportunity for hunters and others that would like to fish these lakes in late fall when they are visiting the Wooten Wildlife Area. These lakes are managed with hatchery trout with some trout available for harvest after October 31.

## Written Testimony (7 comments)

Support: All comments support this proposal and include: a) this may spread out the pressure on the lake; b) any hatchery stocks should be open to fishing all year to reduce pressure on wild species; c) this offers some late fall and early spring fishing opportunities for those with disabilities; d) suggest the lakes be stocked again in late October because there are few fish left after mid-summer.

Oppose: There are no opposing comments.

# Region 2 <br> \# 10. Extend fishing opportunity through the month of October County or Location Information <br> Okanogan Co. 

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Extend fishery through the month of October to provide additional fishing opportunity.

## Explanation

Increase trout fishing opportunity in Long, Pearrygin, Round, and Alta lakes. Converts the closing date regulations so that they are consistent with other lakes in the same area.

## Written Testimony (7 comments)

Support: All comments support this proposal. One person commented, "The water starts to cool down a bit providing for better fishing opportunities and the weather is still decent enough to camp with my family, bringing extra revenue to the State Parks and the local communities in general."

Oppose: There are no opposing comments.

## \# 11. Eastern Brook trout limit removed

## County or Location Information

Chelan and Okanogan counties

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Remove Eastern Brook Trout daily limit for specific lakes. Also allows the retention of two cutthroat trout for Big Tiffany Lake

## Explanation

The proposed regulation is intended to reduce the Eastern brook trout population in Big Tiffany (Okanogan Co.) and Merritt, Myrtle, and Schaefer lakes (Chelan Co.). Formerly, Big Tiffany had a catch and release rule for Cutthroat in an attempt to focus harvest on the brook trout population. We haven't seen any benefits from the liberal brook trout limit, while releasing all Cutthroat.

## Written Testimony ( 9 comments total, 8 online plus 1 email)

Support: Most comments support this proposal and include: a) remove the brook trout limit from all lakes and streams because this fish is a non-native invasive and outcompetes native populations while overpopulating the waters they reside in, resulting in stunted and unusable fish; b) a way to increase populations of native cutthroat trout; c) recommend that the catch limit be removed for brook trout for all waters; d) maintain catch and release of cutthroat but increase limits on brook trout.

Oppose: One person commented that the proposal does not go far enough, because brook trout should be removed from regulatory control completely.

## \# 12. Upper and Lower Green lakes season adjustment County or Location Information <br> Okanogan Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

The fishery opens one month earlier (from March 1 through November 30, instead of April 1 through November 30) and the second season closes one month earlier (December 1 through the last day of February, instead of December 1 through March 31).

## Explanation

These lakes are popular for ice fishing and the ice is typically melted the last month (March) of the season. To provide recreational opportunity at the optimal time for fishing this lake, the season will open one month earlier (March 1) and close one month earlier (last day in February) than the current season.

## Written Testimony ( 2 comments)

Comments for this proposal include: a) might be best to rehabilitate the lakes first because they have been illegally planted with spiny ray fish; b) warming of the region will further reduce ice levels.

## \# 13. Molson Lake daily limit reduced from 5 to 2 fish

## County or Location Information

Okanogan Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Conservation

## Short Description

Daily limit reduced from five to two fish for consistency with adjacent lake.

## Explanation

Molson and Sidley lakes are adjacent to one another. This rule provides a more appropriate limit (two fish) for this small lake and creates consistency with neighboring Sidley Lake.

## Written Testimony (2 comments)

Support: One person stated, "Sidley and Molson rely on catchable trout plants. Both lakes tend to get fished out fairly soon. A two fish limit on each lake would provide consistency, as well as contributing to a lengthier season."

Oppose: No comments oppose this proposal.

## \# 14. Implement year-round season and statewide general rules for selected lakes to manage for mixed species populations

## County or Location Information

Adams and Grant counties

## Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

Convert regulations to statewide general rules (year-round) to increase fishing opportunity on mixed species.

## Explanation

These lakes are no longer managed intensively for trout and are managed as mixed species fisheries. Seasonal to year-round regulation: Brookies Lakes (Grant Co.); Dot Lake (Grant Co.); George Lake (Grant Co.); Herman Lake (Adams Co.); Lower Caliche Lake (Grant Co.); Lyle Lake (Adams Co.); Mirror Lake (Grant Co.); Thread Lake (Adams Co.); and West Caliche Lake (Grant Co.). Special Rules to Statewide General Rules: Alkali Lake (Grant Co.).

## Written Testimony (4 comments)

Support: All comments support this proposal. One person stated that mixed species lakes should be year round waters.

Oppose: No comments oppose this proposal.

## \# 15. Big Beaver, Beth, and Little Beaver lakes fishery enhancement County or Location Information <br> Okanogan Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Conservation

## Short Description

Adjust season from year-round to 4th Saturday in April - Oct. 31 season.

## Explanation

Adjusting the season maximizes available hatchery trout production. These lakes are in a chain and require spring and fall catchable plants to sustain a yearlong fishery. A shortened season will conserve some of the larger catchable fish for other lakes in Okanogan County that typically suffer winterkill.

## Written Testimony (3 comments)

Support: Two comments support this proposal with one person stating that even though these three lakes provide a winter fishery, changing the season to opening day waters should have the beneficial effect of providing carryover fish.

Oppose: One comment opposes this proposal because it reduces fishing opportunity.

## \# 16. Rufus Woods Lake-Eliminate chumming

County or Location Information
Douglas and Okanogan counties

## Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

Eliminate chumming rules on Lake Rufus Woods.

## Explanation

This change aligns the regulations with the Colville Tribal regulations. Chumming is an old practice allowed when significant numbers of kokanee were being entrained to Rufus Woods and this no longer occurs.

## Written Testimony (8 comments)

Support: Two comments support this proposal.
Oppose: Most comments oppose this proposal, with one person stating that it would be nice to continue chumming for triploid trout as they are non-native to the system.

## \# 17. Upper Wheeler Reservoir County or Location Information <br> Chelan Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Open Upper Wheeler Reservoir to fly fishing only, Trout Catch and Release, motors prohibited 4th Sat. in Apr- Oct 31.

## Explanation

The department has an agreement with the Wenatchee Heights Reclamation District to allow this fishery on previously closed water.

## Written Testimony (4 comments)

Support: All comments support this proposal and include: a) fly fishing only lakes are at a premium, so any additional waters are welcome; b) more opportunities mean more spending by the sports people in local areas; c) suggestion that the season open March 1 with the rest of the Eastern Washington lakes.

Oppose: No comments oppose this proposal.

## \# 18. Wapato Lake <br> County or Location Information

Chelan Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

This rule removes the selective gear rule. The seasons will be: Trout - 4th Sat. in April -July 31 - statewide minimum size/daily limit. All Other Gamefish - 4th Sat. in April to October 31 - statewide minimum size/daily limit.

## Explanation

This proposal provides additional recreation opportunity on the healthy warmwater fish population in Wapato Lake.

## Written Testimony (4 comments)

Support: All comments support this proposal and include: a) mixed species fisheries should be under standard gear rules; b) removing the restrictions allows more fishing days and increase opportunities to get kids outdoors; c) recommend modified versus complete removal of selective gear; d) forcing anglers to use barbless single hooks severely limits the lures that can be used to target warmwater gamefish.

Oppose: No comments oppose this proposal.

## \# 19. Washburn Lake Eastern Brook Trout Fishery County or Location Information Okanogan Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

This rule reduces the trout daily limit from 2 to 1, adds selective gear rules and prohibits internal combustion motors.

## Explanation

This proposal is designed to create a quality Eastern Brook Trout fishery.

## Written Testimony ( 5 comments)

Support: Comments that support this proposal include: a) in most years, this lake can produce exceptional size in brook trout and a quality brook trout fishery under selective gear rules will be well received; b) great little lake that has difficult access, the experience is about quality as well as tranquility.

Oppose: Comments that oppose this proposal include: a) Why are we protecting non-native species? ; b) oppose any rule that encourages the non-native eastern brook trout because people transport these nonnative fish to other waters in the area where they compete with native steelhead young for food and shelter; c) if an "exotic" fish is needed then tiger trout can be used, because they will not reproduce if illegally transplanted, and so lessen the impact.

## \# 20. 2 pole fishing opportunities

## County or Location Information

Multiple

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Allow 2 pole fishing in waters where opportunities exist consistent with conservation objectives.

## Explanation

The use of 2 poles will provide additional recreational opportunity.

Proposal 20. Two pole opportunity for all species except sturgeon.

## Written Testimony (13 comments)

Support: Most comments support this proposal and include suggestions to provide more 2 pole fishing opportunities.

Oppose: One comment stated, "If "management" is so poor that we need to reduce numbers by adding a second pole then a rule change is the least of the issue." Another comment was that WDFW should not allow 2 poles where endangered species are present, because just one person can decimate a population of a few individuals.

## \# 21. Cle Elum Lake adjust size limit and daily limits for Kokanee and remove daily limit for Lake trout, brown trout and eastern brook trout

## County or Location Information

Kittitas Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Reduces kokanee daily limit from 12 to 5 and sets a slot limit (Min. size 9", Max. size 15"), and removes the daily limit for lake trout, brown trout and eastern brook trout

## Explanation

This regulation is associated with efforts to reintroduce sockeye salmon into the Cle Elum basin and is intended to improve likelihood of success.

## Written Testimony ( 23 comments)

Support: Most comments support this proposal with comments that include: a) removing limits to more aggressive species will help improve salmonid fitness; b) restoring the ecosystem should be a priority for WDFW; c) applaud WDFW staff for having the courage to propose unlimited harvest of brown trout and non-native chars.

Oppose: One opposing comment was that the slot change may result in the release of many dead kokanee and that this proposal conflicts with proposal \#23. The person recommends a 10 fish limit to be compatible with the other nearby kokanee lakes.

## \# 22. McCabe Pond <br> County or Location Information <br> Kittitas Co . <br> Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

Allow non-motorized personal flotation devices to increase fishing opportunities and help protect sensitive riparian habitat.

## Explanation

This small pond has limited shoreline fishing access due to vegetative cover. Allowing non-motorized personal flotation devices would allow increased fishing opportunities at this popular fishing location and help protect sensitive riparian habitat.

## Written Testimony ( 5 comments)

Support: Most comments support this proposal and its value for riparian habitat. One suggestion was to also make this a catch and release pond so that when the Yakima River is high or unfishable, this can be a backup location.

Oppose: Comments that oppose this proposal include: a) McCabe Pond is so small in size that nonmotorized flotation devices would greatly interfere with bank fishers and create recreational fishing conflicts; b) there are numerous opportunities within a few miles of this site for such activity.

## \# 23. Kachess and Keechelus Kokanee daily limit <br> County or Location Information

Kittitas Co.

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Conservation

## Short Description

Reduces daily bag limit of kokanee to 10 fish consistent with kokanee fisheries statewide and to conserve kokanee in these waters.

## Explanation

These populations are supported by stocking hatchery fry on an annual basis. The 16 kokanee daily limit is appropriate in waters which have abundant natural reproduction and are not dependent on stocking hatchery fry.

## Written Testimony (3 comments)

Support: Support for this proposal includes: a) large limits encourage wasteful behavior; b) not having kokanee count toward the daily trout limit is a major positive; c) request to retain 16 kokanee limit lakes when possible.

Oppose: One comment recommends the development of a no-fishing area near the mouths of bull trout spawning tributaries in these lakes as well as bait restrictions to gear such as circle hooks to reduce the potential that the hook will capture a bull trout in the eye.

# \# 24. Naches River: increase catch and release opportunity County or Location Information <br> Yakima Co. 

Type of Rule Change Proposal<br>Recreational

## Short Description

Additional recreation opportunity requiring catch and release for trout on the Naches River from Rattlesnake Creek upstream.

## Explanation

Require catch and release for trout from Rattlesnake Creek upstream. This will provide additional catch and release opportunity on the Naches River while maintaining some harvest opportunity below the confluence of the Tieton River.

## Written Testimony ( 313 total comments, with 308 unique comments and one comment received via email)

This proposal received by far the most public comment of all the Columbia Basin proposals, with most supporting it regardless of residency.

Support: Comments in support of this proposal include: a) this will make the Naches a quality, easily accessible fishing vacation similar to Idaho's Saint Joe River; b) recommendations to extend catch and release to the entire river, the tributaries, and other rivers; c) this will also cut down on fish mortality among the natural population of trout that migrate up river to reproduce; d) fishery has improved since the hatchery plants were discontinued in 1993; e) fishing is better in the current catch and release section of the Naches River; f) provides the ability to fish the river each year, observe the growth and stability of the fishery, and ensure that children and grandchildren can enjoy the resource; g) this will translate into longer term annual license revenue as well as long-term economic interest in local communities; h) data and publications definitively show that resident and anadromous $O$. mykiss life-history forms are members of a single, reproductively-mixed population when they coexist within the same geographic location.

Oppose: Opposing comments include: a) prefer a one trout daily limit; b) there are too many regulations on the river and keeping track of where and when things change is a task in itself; c) special interest groups want the very lower portion of the Naches River to be designated for the retaining of fish but this area has the least amount of access to the river and there are no campgrounds along the river; d) fishery biologists have recently stated that their creel census revealed that $90 \%$ of those fishing in the upper portion of the Naches River release their fish anyway; e) there is no biological basis for this rule change and this proposal will reduce opportunity.; f) perhaps a more important issue is whether this regulation will be enforced; g) allow for a 2 fish limit for youth under the age of 16.

# \# 25. Cowlitz 2 pole and barbed hooks fishery 

## County or Location Information

Cowlitz and Lewis counties

## Type of Rule Change Proposal

Recreational

## Short Description

Allow the use of 2 poles and barbed hook June 1 - July 31 in Cowlitz River up to the boundary at the barrier dam.

## Explanation

Beginning June 1 through July in Cowlitz River up to the boundary at the barrier dam, barbed hooks and two pole fishing will be allowed. This will focus on returning hatchery summer steelhead.

## Written Testimony (38 comments)

Support: Comments from those supporting this proposal include: a) agree with 2 pole idea but prefer barbless hooks; b) barbed hooks should never be used in any water where wild fish release is required; c) recommend extending this rule from May $1^{\text {st }}$ until July $31^{\text {st. }}$; d) the Cowlitz River has no true wild fish left or very few so the Cowlitz River shouldn't have a barbless hook restriction at all; e) recommend including the North Fork of the Lewis; f) extend this fishery to August $15^{\text {th }} ; \mathrm{g}$ ) this will lower impacts on the river and result in less time on the river, less pollution, and less hatchery fish --all plusses; h) a common sense proposed rule change that would not appreciably affect listed species because the primary targeted species during this time period is an out of basin, segregated, hatchery stock (Skamania Summer Steelhead) released primarily for sport harvest; h) increase the daily limit.

Oppose: Opposing comments include: a) simplify the rules; b) this will increase "snagging" and "flossing" which are already problems in this fishery; c) allowing two rods per person creates more problems than it is worth for bank anglers because there is only so much bank access and some folks are getting pushed out due to lack of space; d) a number of fish are lost due to tangling with the second unattended rod when fishing two rods.

## \# 26. Elochoman River opener <br> County or Location Information <br> Wahkiakum Co. <br> Type of Rule Change Proposal <br> Recreational

## Short Description

Open the last Saturday in May to Friday before the first Saturday in June. Catch and release except 2 hatchery steelhead allowed.

## Explanation

The proposed rule increases harvest opportunity on hatchery summer run steelhead.

## Written Testimony (8 comments)

Support: Most comments support this proposal with comments that include: a) this along with mandatory hatchery steelhead retention will allow more angling opportunity and actual harvest of hatchery steelhead; b) open the river up to Beaver Creek Hatchery or slightly above to allow a fishery on summer steelhead while maintaining the integrity of wild fish that are in the system.

Oppose: One person commented that catch and release is not a good idea because it takes all the fight out of a fish and the fish is likely to die. They suggest adopting this proposal only if barbless hooks are required, since most anglers do not handle a fish correctly while releasing it.

No natural origin summer steelhead populations are found in these basins; however, they receive hatchery summer steelhead smolt plants. Wild winter run adult steelhead and smolts are unlikely to be in the area from the first Saturday in June through July 31 and no salmon would be expected until mid-August.

## Written Testimony ( 12 comments)

Support: One comment urges WDFW to also consider mandatory retention during these fisheries, because these fish are created solely for harvest opportunity.

Oppose: Most comments oppose this proposal and include: a) barbless hooks should be the norm; b) if we have to have barbless hooks in the Columbia River, then should not allow barbed hooks anywhere; c) removing the barbless hook rule will further confuse fishers as to where barbed hooks are illegal; d) compounds enforcement issues; e) barbed hooks are not needed to play and land fish successfully; f) these rivers still contain wild salmon and steelhead year round, many of which are caught as juveniles in sport fisheries; g) barbless single point hooks should be a state wide regulation for all species where their release is required.

## \# 31. Salmon Creek - expand area available to fishing for hatchery steelhead from 72nd Avenue Bridge to 182 Avenue Bridge

## ATTACHMENT A Sportfishing Regulations 2015-16

## Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules:

The department makes similar adjustments to recreational rules annually to maximize conservation and recreational-fishing opportunity. This proposal makes changes to Columbia Basin recreational fishing regulations and implements "Stream Strategy" for all water bodies in the Eastside and Southwest geographical areas. Stream Strategy means the river is closed unless specifically listed as open to fishing by rule. The department also proposes reorganizing the sturgeon provisions so that they primarily reside in WAC 220-56-282 and making technical changes to clarify, correct, and update language.

## Reasons supporting proposal:

Adopting Stream Strategy for Eastside and Southwest Washington water bodies promotes consistency in the WDFW administrative code as it is already in place for Puget Sound and Coastal recreational fishing rules. Making recreational fishing regulations consistent across the state will promote better understanding of rules by fishers. Additionally, the changes in this proposal are needed to make necessary adjustments to recreational fishing rules based on department data, public feedback, and changes in fish and shellfish populations. The department also proposes amendments for conservation purposes and to provide greater fishing opportunity. Technical changes are needed to ensure clarity and uniformity in the code and in response to the recent reorganization of freshwater recreational fishing rules.

WAC 220-56-210 Fly fishing. (1) It is unlawful to fish in waters restricted to "fly fishing only" with the use of:
(a) A fixed spool reel.
(b) Fishing line other than conventional fly line or conventional "Tenkara" fly line, except that other line may be used for backing and leader if it is attached to not less than 25 feet of conventional fly line.
(c) Hooks that exceed $1 / 2$ inch when measured from point to shank.
(d) Not more than two flies each with a barbless single hook.
(e) Bait.
(f) Weight attached to the leader or line.
(2) Only knotless nets may be used to land fish in waters restricted to "fly fishing only."
(3) Violation of this subsection is an infraction, punishable under RCW 77.15.160.

It is unlawful to possess fish taken with gear in violation of the provisions of this section. Possession of fish while using gear in violation of the provisions of this section is a rebuttable presumption that the fish were taken with such gear. Possession of such fish is punishable under RCW 77.15.380 Unlawful recreational fishing in the second degree-Penalty, unless the fish are taken in the amounts or manner to constitute a violation of RCW 77.15.370 Unlawful recreational fishing in the first degree-Penalty.
(4) "Fly" means a lure on which thread, feathers, hackle, or yarn cover a minimum of half the shank of the hook. Metallic colored tape, tinsel, mylar, or beadeyes may be used as an integral part of the design of the fly pattern.
(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, persons who have a permanent disability that significantly limits the use of one or both upper extremities may use spinning gear and may fish from a floating device equipped with an electric motor in lakes where fishing from a floating device is allowed in fly fishing only waters as provided for in this section.
(a) A fisher with a disability must apply for a fly fishing special use permit by presenting a letter from a physician stating that the fisher's disability is permanent and that, because of the inability to use one or both upper extremities, the fisher is physically incapable of using conventional fly fishing gear.
(b) The fisher will be issued a fly fishing special use permit in the form of a wearable tag. The fisher must have the special use permit in his or her possession at all times while using spin casting gear in fly fishing only waters, and may display the permit on outer clothing.
(c) It is lawful for persons in possession of a fly fishing special use permit to use the following gear:
(i) Fishers may use spin casting gear with a casting bubble.
(ii) Monofilament line is permitted with no limit on the breaking strength of the line.
(iii) Hook size and barb restrictions, fishing fly requirements, and bait and weight prohibitions as provided for in this section apply to both conventional fly fishing and spin-bubble fly fishing.

WAC 220-56-282 Sturgeon-Areas, seasons, limits and unlawful acts. (1) It is unlawful to retain green sturgeon.
(2) It is permissible to catch and release white sturgeon in saltwater waterways year-round. However, for freshwater waterways, including freshwater Puget Sound tributaries, it is permissible to catch and release white sturgeon only when the season is open for salmon or game fish, unless otherwise provided.
(3) It is permissible to catch and release, but unlawful to retain, white sturgeon in the following areas:
(a) Coastal waters and tributaries of coastal waters; and
(b) Puget Sound waters and tributaries of Puget Sound.
(4) It is permissible to catch and release, but unlawful to retain, white sturgeon year-round in the following waters, unless otherwise provided by department rule:
(a) The Columbia River and its tributaries below Bonneville Dam;
(b) The mainstem Columbia River and its tributaries downstream from where the river forms the boundary between Oregon and Washington;
(c) The mainstem Columbia and its tributaries from Priest Rapids Dam to Chief Joseph Dam; and
(d) The Snake River and tributaries from ((Lower Granite)) Ice Harbor Dam upstream.
(5) It is unlawful to fish for sturgeon in the Columbia River and tributaries upstream of Chief Joseph Dam.
(6) The following limits and requirements apply in areas where it is permissible to retain sturgeon:
(a) The daily limit is one white sturgeon.
(b) The possession limit is two daily limits of fresh, frozen, or processed white sturgeon.
(c) The annual personal-use limit for white sturgeon from April 1 through March 31 is two fish, regardless of where the angler takes the sturgeon.
(d) The maximum fork-length is 54 inches.
(e) The minimum fork-length is 38 inches, except the minimum fork-length is 43 inches in:
(i) The mainstem Columbia and its tributaries from The Dalles Dam to Priest Rapids Dam; and
(ii) The Snake River from the Snake River Confluence Protection Area to ((Lower Granite)) Ice Harbor Dam.
(f) It is unlawful to fail to release undersize or oversize sturgeon immediately.
(g) Once an angler reaches his or her annual limit of white sturgeon, he or she may continue to fish for white sturgeon in the mainstem Columbia River downstream from where the river forms the common boundary between Oregon and Washington, unless otherwise provided by department rule, so long as the angler releases all subsequent sturgeon immediately.
(h) It is unlawful to fish for sturgeon with terminal gear other than bait and one single-point barbless hook.
(i) It is permissible to use artificial scent with bait when fishing for white sturgeon.
(j) It is unlawful to use a gaff or other body-penetrating device while restraining, handling, or landing a sturgeon.
(k) It is unlawful to fish for or possess sturgeon from freshwater, except the Chehalis River, from one hour after official sunset to one hour before official sunrise.
(l) It is unlawful to possess sturgeon eggs in the field without retaining the intact carcass of the fish from which the eggs have been removed.
(7) A violation of this section is an infraction, punishable under RCW 77.15.160, unless the person has harvested sturgeon. If the person has harvested sturgeon, the violation is punishable under RCW 77.15.380, Unlawful recreational fishing in the second degree-Penalty, unless the sturgeon are taken in the amounts or manner to constitute a violation of RCW 77.15.370, Unlawful recreational fishing in the first degree-Penalty.
(8) It is unlawful to possess sturgeon taken with gear in violation of the provisions of this section. Possession of sturgeon while using gear in violation of the provisions of this section is a rebuttable presumption that the sturgeon were taken with such gear. Possession of such sturgeon is punishable under RCW 77.15.380, Unlawful recreational fishing in the second degree-Penalty, unless the sturgeon are taken in the amounts or manner to constitute a violation of RCW 77.15.370, Unlawful recreational fishing in the first degree—Penalty.

AMENDATORY SECTION (Amending WSR 14-04-120, filed 2/4/14, effective 3/7/14)

WAC 220-310-175 Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules-General rules. The following provisions and definitions apply to this section through WAC 220-310-200.
(1) It is unlawful to fish for, take, or possess salmon from freshwater streams and lakes that are not specifically listed as open for salmon fishing.
(2) Waters listed as open during a specific date range that do not reference a particular species are open during the date range for game fish only.
(3) Rivers, streams, and beaver ponds ((that drain into Puget Sound, the Strait of Juan de Fuca, or the Pacific Ocean (excluding the Columbia River)) ) are closed to fishing unless specifically listed as open.
(4) All limits are daily limits, unless otherwise provided.
(5) Within Puget Sound, beaver ponds located within or adjoining streams that are listed as open to trout and other game fish follow the same rules as the stream, except as otherwise provided.
(6) A "float" or "bobber" means a hookless, floating device that is attached to or slides along the mainline or leader above the hook(s) for the purpose of suspending hook(s) (which are not part of the bait, lure, or fly) off the bottom of the stream or lake and visually signal (from the surface of the water) a fish's strike at the hook(s).
(7) "Lead jig" means a lure consisting of a hook permanently or temporarily attached directly to a lead weight by any method.
(8) "Lead weight" means material constructed of lead and applied to a fishing line or lure and designed to help keep the hook, bait, or lure underwater.
(9) "Unmarked salmon" means salmon without either a clipped ventral fin or a clipped adipose fin as evidenced by a healed scar.
(10) Kokanee/sockeye definitions:
(a) For Lake Washington and the Lake Washington Ship Canal in King County, kokanee and sockeye less than fifteen inches in length are considered kokanee and kokanee and sockeye fifteen inches and over in length are considered sockeye salmon.
(b) For Wenatchee Lake (Chelan County), kokanee and sockeye under sixteen inches are considered kokanee and kokanee and sockeye sixteen inches and over are considered sockeye salmon.
(11)(a) A violation of this section through WAC 220-310-200 is an infraction, punishable under RCW 77.15.160, unless the person has harvested fish. If the person has harvested fish, the violation is punishable under RCW 77.15.380, Unlawful recreational fishing in the second degree-Penalty, unless the fish are taken in the amounts or manner to constitute a violation of RCW 77.15.370, Unlawful recreational fishing in the first degree-Penalty.
(b) Freshwater terminal gear restrictions:
(i) Terminal gear restrictions apply to all species, including salmon, unless otherwise provided.
(ii) In all waters with freshwater terminal gear restrictions including, but not limited to, night closures, selective gear rules, whitefish gear rules, single-point barbless hooks required, fly-fish-
ing only, and anti-snagging rules, violation of the gear rules is an infraction, punishable under RCW 77.15.160.
(iii) It is unlawful to possess fish taken with gear in violation of the freshwater terminal gear restrictions. Possession of fish while using gear in violation of the freshwater terminal gear restrictions is a rebuttable presumption that the fish were taken with such gear. Possession of such fish is punishable under RCW 77.15.380, Unlawful recreational fishing in the second degree-Penalty, unless the fish are taken in the amounts or manner to constitute a violation of RCW 77.15.370, Unlawful recreational fishing in the first degree-Penalty.
(12) For sturgeon rules in the Columbia Basin (WAC 220-310-185, 220-310-195, and 220-310-200), see WAC 220-56-282, Sturgeon-Areas, seasons, limits and unlawful acts.

(c) Salmon and trout handling rules provided in WAC 220-56-118 apply to the Columbia River, except from February 15 through June 15 in the mainstem Columbia from the Rocky Point/Tongue Point line upstream to the Washington-Oregon border where WAC 220-56-118 applies only to anglers fishing from vessels less than 30 feet in length (as substantiated by Coast Guard documentation or Marine Board registration).
(d) From Buoy 10 to the Washington/Oregon border: From August 1 through December 31, each angler aboard a vessel may deploy salmon/ steelhead angling gear until the daily salmon/steelhead limit for all anglers aboard has been achieved.
(e) Open year-round unless otherwise provided.
(f) Barbless hooks are required for salmon and steelhead.
(2) Rules by river section:

(C) Closed to angling from a floating device or by any method except hand-casted gear from shore from Bonneville Dam downstream to a line from the Hamilton Island boat ramp to an Oregon boundary marker on the westernmost tip of Robins Island.
(ii) Camas Slough:
(A) It is permissible for an angler licensed in Oregon or Washington to fish from a floating device.
