4. Geoduck Diver License Rulemaking – Briefing and Public Hearing

Frank Hawley, Licensing and Budget Policy Manager briefed the Commission on repealing WAC 220-52-01904, adopted at the end of 2014 due to changes to state law. WAC 220-52-01905 becoming effective January 1, 2015, makes WAC 220-52-01904 no longer necessary.

No one signed up to provide testimony.

Items 6, 8 & 9 were heard before item 5.

6. 2015 – 16 North of Falcon Policy C-3608 - Decision

John Long, State Salmon Manager, requested adoption of the North of Falcon Policy C-3608 which would be effective through December 2016. The policy provides direction and guidance to the agency as it conducts the annual process for defining salmon fishing seasons throughout the state.

Commissioner Wecker moved, seconded by Commissioner Mahnken to approve the North of Falcon policy, C-3608, as presented. Motion passed.

8. Priority Landscapes - Briefing

Cynthia Wilkerson, Lands Conservation and Restoration Section Manager and Lauri Vigue, Environmental Planner, briefed the Commission on the Statewide Priority Landscapes Initiative aimed at identifying and mobilizing WDFW cross-programmatic resources to conserve iconic landscapes whose future status depends on collaboration across multiple jurisdictions and interests.

9. Lands 20/20 - Briefing

Cynthia Wilkerson, Lands Conservation and Restoration Section Manager briefed the Commission on the lands 20/20 process and the list of projects approved through the 2014 Lands 20/20 process. The Department will seek funding for projects approved in the Lands 20/20 process.

5. Columbia River Commercial Catch Area Amendments – Decision

Ron Roler, Columbia River Policy Coordinator, requested approval from the Commission on inclusion of new commercial catch areas to aid in management of existing and emergent commercial fishing opportunities within the Columbia River.

Commissioner Wecker moved to amend WAC 220-22-010 by adding two catch areas, 1E1 and Cathlamet Channel Select Area, and inserting a description of catch area 2S as it is written in WAC 220-330-030 and amend WAC 220-32-050 by adding catch area 1E1 as proposed; it was seconded by Commissioner Kehne. All were in favor. The motion passed.

7. Steller Sea Lion and Tufted Puffin Status Review – Briefing and Public Hearing

Penny Becker, Listing and Recovery Section Manager, and Gary Wiles, Biologist, briefed the Commission on the status review of the Steller Sea Lion and the Tufted Puffin.

12. Willapa Bay Salmon Management Policy - Briefing and Public Hearing

Steve Thiesfeld, Region 6 Fish Program Manager briefed the Commission on Willapa Bay Salmon Management challenges, described the public process, and asked for additional guidance on management options to be considered in the draft policy.

All of the Commissioners agreed that the policy adoption needed to be delayed.

The Commission suggested that staff conduct an analysis of North River natural origin Chinook salmon to determine if those stocks deserve higher levels of protection. It also suggested that the policy include a commitment to conduct a study of the economic value of surplus fish that reach the hatcheries.

Commissioner Wecker made a motion to adopt the proposed Willapa Salmon

Management Policy no earlier than June and to provide guidance in April needed for
the North of Falcon season setting process. Commissioner Mahnken seconded the
motion, all were in favor, motion passed.

13. Miscellaneous and Meeting Debrief

Two Blue Sheet requests were submitted.

Commissioner Wecker made a motion for a briefing on Statewide Steelhead Plan and Implementation. Commissioner Mahnken seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Commissioner Mahnken made a motion for a briefing on Marine Survival of Salmon (Salish Sea Program). Commissioner Kehoe seconded the motion. All were in favor; the motion passed.
