Commissioner Smith moved to approve the Mount Saint Helens thinning project as presented, seconded by Commissioner Thorburn, all were in favor and the motion passed.

The Commission approved the acceptance of the 5.41 acre Peterson property in Whatcom County.

No one signed up to provide public testimony.
