6. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Lower Granite Dam – Fish Passage, Including Adult Salmonid Trapping and Smolt Outmigration - Briefing

Elizabeth Holdren and Stephen Hampton, USACE Fisheries Project Biologists and Joe Bumgarner, Biologist, WDFW provided an overview on the Lower Granite Dam.

7. Lower Snake River Compensation Plan (LSRCP) - Overview

- Director Unsworth thanked the regional staff and Commissioner Holzmiller for the great work setting up the meeting.
