The Director provided a written report and briefly discussed various topics including:

4. <u>Land Transactions – This item was removed from the agenda</u>

5. <u>Lands Showcase Marketing and Communication Results - Briefing</u>

Cynthia Wilkerson, Lands Division Manager, and Kristin Nielsen, Business Analyst, Rebecca Elmore-Yalch, Northwest Research Group, and Carey Evenson from C+C briefed the Commission on the marketing and communications portion of the Lands Showcase project. The consultants presented the results of a survey sent to Washingtonians to establish their awareness and understanding of WDFW's Wildlife Areas, and the online community board used to determine the concepts for the 'brand pillars' used to develop communications strategies.

6. Pronghorn - Briefing

Rich Harris, Ph.D., Bighorn Sheep, Moose, Mountain Goat, and Pronghorn Antelope Section Manager, Game Division provided a briefing on the history of pronghorns and pronghorn management in Washington, including translocation efforts, current status and future management considerations and options.

7. 2019 – 20 North of Falcon Policy C-3608 – Decision

Kyle Adicks, Intergovernmental Salmon Manager requested adoption of proposed modifications to the North of Falcon Policy C-3608 (currently in effect through December 31, 2018) setting guidelines for salmon management.

Commissioner McIsaac made a motion seconded by Commissioner Thorburn to accept the changes recommended by staff and add two additional changes:

- 1. Under the section titled *Other Species* on page 4 strike do not have unacceptable impacts and replace it with <u>provide proper protection to SRKW.</u>
- 2. Under the sections titled *Grays Harbor, Willipa Bay and Columbia* River on page 2 remove provided by the Commission and add <u>adopted by the Commission following notice and opportunity for review and comment.</u>

The motion passed.

8. Puget Sound Chinook Harvest Management Plan - Update

Kyle Adicks, Intergovernmental Salmon Manager provided an update on the status of the Puget Sound Chinook Harvest Management Plan.

9. Columbia River Concurrent Night Fishing Rules - Briefing

Bill Tweit, Special Assistant and Ryan Lothrop, Columbia River Fishery Manager provided the Commission an assessment on non-concurrent recreational night fishing regulations with Oregon for salmon, steelhead and sturgeon in the Columbia River, and an inventory of Columbia River night fisheries exclusively managed by WDFW for these species.

10. Wildlife Rehabilitation Rules - Briefing and Public Hearing

Patricia Thompson, Wildlife Rehabilitation and Falconry Manager, Wildlife Program briefed the Commission on proposed amendments to WAC 220-450-060 through WAC 220-450-220 and the history, reasoning, and process behind those amendments.
