
The Proposed Amendments and Supplemental Adjustments

- Will -
 - Define more clearly requirements, restrictions, and best practices of wildlife rehabilitation
 - Enhance ability of the department to assist with and resolve compliance issues
 - Enable and support permitted wildlife rehabilitators to practice their profession using their own best judgement but within agreed upon standards and rules



WAC 220-450-060 Definitions

- Proposed Amendments
 - Eliminate unnecessary definitions
 - Add new terms examples
 - Habituate; Tame
 - Nonreleasable
 - Patient record
 - Refine current definitions
 - Imprinting vs. mal-imprinting
- Supplemental Adjustment
 - Euthanasia delete "inability to release"



WAC 220-450-070 Wildlife rehabilitation permits - requirements and restrictions

- Proposed Amendments
 - Added
 - Clerical requirements
 - Public transport
 - Cervid endorsement
 - Strengthened
 - Raptor endorsements
 - Continuing Education



- Removed "modified" permit from permittee in good standing
- Added "large carnivore biologist" to Carnivore Endorsement



WAC 220-450-080 Responsibilities of primary permittees and subpermittees

- Proposed Amendments
 - Added requirements of primary permittees applying for subpermittees
 - Only two off-site subpermittees per Primary Permittee
 - Once per week visit and file report
 - Added subpermittee requirements
 - 300 documented hours of experience
- No proposed Supplemental Adjustments

WAC 220-450-090 Permit modification, suspension, or revocation

- Proposed Amendments
 - Added
 - Step-by-step compliance system
 - Subject matter experts
 - Re-application after revocation
 - Removed violations defined elsewhere
- Supplemental Adjustments
 - Variable timelines within the individual plans
 - Change "Publicly displaying" to "Directly displaying"



WAC 220-450-100 Facility requirements and inspections and off-site care

- Proposed Amendments
 - Emphasized separation from domestic animals
 - Oiled wildlife added
 - Added disease reporting, quarantine, and euthanasia
 - Enhanced
 - Off-site subpermittee restrictions
 - Inspection ability without permittee present
- Supplemental Adjustments
 - Subpermittees may not operate their own facilities





WAC 220-450-110 Releasing wildlife

- Proposed Amendments
 - Added amphibians and reptiles
 - No release of non-natives or natives in captivity
 - Tightened release restrictions
 - Cervids
 - Release date on or before Oct 31
 - Non-native species
 - Release only where abundant
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments



WAC 220-450-120 Veterinary care

- Proposed Amendments
 - Tightened transfer requirement
- No Proposed Supplemental Amendments

WAC 220-450-130 Records retention and reporting requirements

- Proposed Amendments
 - Listed required records
 - Generalized reportable diseases
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments



WAC 220-450-140 Falconers assisting with raptor rehabilitation

- Proposed Amendments
 - Clarified falconer role
 - Added prohibition on transfer to falconry permit
- Supplemental Adjustments
 - Raptors may be kept at falconer's facility



WAC 220-450-150 Transfer, import, and export of wildlife and restrictions

- Proposed Amendments
 - Prohibits transfer of cervids between WDFW Regions, and, cervids, bats, and beaver between E and W WA
 - No intake of cervids from outside of Region
 - Supports WAC 220-450-030 Live wildlife – Taking from the wild, importation, possession, transfer, and holding in captivity
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments






WAC 220-450-160 Possession of dead wildlife and wildlife parts

- Proposed Amendment
 - Expanded to all wildlife parts
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments



WAC 220-450-170 Disposition of nonreleasable and over-habituated, malimprinted, and tamed wildlife

- Proposed Amendments
 - Allows fees and requires education information
 - Education birds can foster care
 - Prohibits certain species as education animals
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments



WAC 220-450-180 Euthanizing wildlife

- Proposed Amendments
 - Added language to protect wildlife from prolonged suffering
 - Added disease reporting
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments





WAC 220-450-190 Disposing of wildlife remains

- Proposed Amendments
 - Added reportable diseases and oiled wildlife carcass disposal
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments

WAC 220-450-200 Commercial uses

- Proposed Amendments
 - Simplified to allow collection of funds for certain activities
- No Proposed Supplemental Adjustments

WAC 220-450-210 and WAC 220-450-220

- Proposed for repeal
 - All oiled wildlife rehabilitation rules and standards are in the general WACs.
