



#### **Elk Herd Status**




#### **Elk Herd Status**

General Season and Special Permit Combined




## Elk General Season Proposals WAC 220-415-050

- Proposed to add early archery Any elk opportunity and early muzzleloader 3 pt. Min. or antlerless opportunities in EA 6014 to help mitigate damage issues
- Proposed to shift legal elk for early archery in GMU
   652 from Any elk to 3 pt. min. or antlerless
- Proposed to allow opportunities to harvest antlered elk in EA 6013 during early and late archery


#### **Elk General Seasons Continued**

- Proposed to shift the legal elk for early muzzleloader in GMU 505 from 3 pt. min. to 3 pt. min. or antierless to help mitigate damage
- Proposed to shift the legal elk for late muzzleloader in GMU 667 from 3 pt. min. to 3 pt. min. or antierless and reduce the season length by 7 days
- Maintained a placeholder for an early archery general elk season in the Colockum and Yakima elk herd areas until 2018 harvest estimates and 2019 spring survey data are available


2019 survey indicates the Yakima herd remains
 ~1,200 elk (13%) below objective and calf
 recruitment rates remain below historical levels




- Cow numbers are near objective
- 2019 estimate = 6,019 cows



- Total bull and adult bull numbers have declined by ~50%
- The number of spikes recruited has declined by ~55%




- Recreational antlerless harvest has been reduced substantially
- Early archery season only accounted for ~60 of the 300-400 antlerless elk harvested during recreational and damage hunts combined



#### Colockum Elk Herd

- At objective in 2018
- Recreational cow harvest reduced substantially
- Antlerless harvest during archery general seasons declined by ~155 elk in 2018
- Calf recruitment rates expected to be adequate

Page 5: Under Early Archery General Elk Seasons for Eastern Washington in GMUs 328, 329, 336, 340, 352, 356, and 364; update the season dates under 2019 Dates to be Sept. 14-19 and leave 2020 dates blank.

## Elk Permit Seasons WAC 220-415-060

- Quality special permits were adjusted through the special permit allocation process and reduced in the Yakima, Colockum, and Blue Mountains herds
- Adjusted antlerless special permits up or down with the goal of maintaining herds at objective or moving them toward population objective
- Proposed adding special permit opportunities in GMU 334 in conjunction with existing opportunities in the Colockum and Yakima herd areas

#### **Permit Seasons Continued**

- Proposed adding modern firearm, archery, and muzzleloader special bull permits and Youth special permits for Spike bull only in EA 1015 to compensate for reduced antlerless permits
- Proposed expanding Youth special permits for Designated Areas in Region 5 to include holders of a muzzleloader or archery transport tag
- Proposed eliminating Antlerless permit hunts for Disabled and 65+ Senior hunters in EA 6011


## Recommended Floor Change Elk Permit Seasons

- 2019 surveys indicate the Blue Mountains elk herd is ~1,300 elk (25%) below objective
- 3<sup>rd</sup> straight year with lower than normal calf recruitment rates
  - 3-year average = 22:100
  - 07'-16' average 30:100
- Propose reductions in special permits for antlerless elk in the Blue Mountains
