Date:	6:00 PM Tuesday May 6, 2014 through 11:59 PM Thursday July 31, 2014
Area:	SMCRA 1F,1G, 1H (Zone 6)
Gear:	Hoopnets, Dipnets, Hook and Line
Allowed Sales	Salmon, steelhead, shad, walleye, carp, catfish, bass, and yellow perch may be sold or kept for subsistence. Sturgeon between 43-54 inches fork length harvested in The Dalles or John Day Pools and sturgeon between 38-54 inches fork length in the Bonneville pool may not be sold but may be kept for subsistence.
Misc.	Sanctuaries applicable to these gear types apply

<i>Yakama Nation Tributary Fisheries</i>	
Season	6:00 PM Tuesday May 6, 2014 through 11:59 PM Thursday July 31, 2014, and only during those days and hours when the tributaries listed below are open under lawfully enacted Yakama Nation tribal subsistence fishery regulations for enrolled Yakama Nation members.
Area	Drano Lake, Wind River and Klickitat River
Gear	Hoop nets, dip bag nets, and rod and reel with hook-and-line. Gill nets may only be used in Drano Lake.
Allowable Sales	Salmon, steelhead, shad, carp, catfish, walleye, bass, or yellow perch. Sturgeon between 43-54 inches fork length harvested in tributaries within The Dalles or John Day Pools and sturgeon between 38-54 inches fork length harvested in tributaries within Bonneville pool may not be sold but may be kept for subsistence

Treaty Bank Fisheries Downstream of Bonneville Dam

Season	6:00 PM Tuesday May 6, 2014 through 11:59 PM Thursday July 31, 2014, and <u>only during those days and hours when the area is open under lawfully enacted tribal fishery regulations for enrolled tribal members in accordance with each tribe's MOU/MOA</u>
Participants	Tribal members may participate under the conditions described in the 2007 Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Yakama Nation (YN), in the 2010 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR), in the 2010 MOU with the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Spring Reservation (CTWS), and in the 2011 MOU with the Nez Perce Tribe. Tribal members fishing below Bonneville Dam must carry an official tribal enrollment card
Area	SMCRA 1E, immediately downstream of Bonneville Dam. Area open as described in each tribal MOU/MOA
Gear	Hoop nets, dip bag nets, and rod and reel with hook and line
Allowable Sales	Salmon, steelhead, shad, carp, catfish, walleye, bass, or yellow perch. Sturgeon retention is prohibited, and sturgeon may not be sold or retained for ceremonial or subsistence purposes. Sale of platform or hook-and-line-caught fish is allowed. Sales may not occur on USACE property

24-hour quick reporting required for Washington wholesale dealers, per WAC 220-69-240. Requires all Washington wholesale buyers purchasing fish from commercial fisheries to send a report of their landings to WDFW within 24 hours of the closure of the fishery via either:
