Sturgeon from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be kept for subsistence. Legal fish landed during the open periods are allowed to be sold after the period concludes.	
Sanctuaries:	River mouth and dam closed areas applicable to gillnets in effect. The Spring Creek Hatchery sanctuary is not necessary this time of year.	
Additional:	24-hour quick reporting required for Washington wholesale dealers, per WAC 220-69-240, except that landings must be reported within 24-hours of completing the fish ticket.

Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Legal fish landed during the open periods are may be sold after the period concludes. Sturgeon may not be retained in fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam in this area. The sale of fish is not authorized on Army Corps of Engineers property downstream of Bonneville Dam. Fish must be transported elsewhere for sale.		
Additional:	24-hour quick reporting required for Washington buyers, pursuant to WAC 220-69-240 except that landings must be reported within 24-hours of completing the fish ticket.
