Treaty Commercial spring Chinook Gillnet fishery

STOCK STATUS

• The stock status was presented in Fact Sheet #4a and in the January 27, 2016 Joint Staff Report.

TREATY INDIAN FISHERIES

- Under current forecast run size the allowed harvest rate under the U.S. v. Oregon Management Agreement is 9.1% which equates to an allowed catch of 17,181.
- All four tribes will have finished their permit gillnet fisheries by the end of this week.
- The preliminary treaty harvest to date along with expectations for the platform and hook and line fisheries through June 15 are shown in the table below.

- All four tribes have decided that with the number of fish available this year that it is appropriate to allow their members to sell their catch in the Zone 6 platform and hook and line fisheries.
- Additionally, the Yakama Nation will allow commercial sales in their Zone 6 tributary fisheries during their regularly scheduled openings.
- At this time, the tribal fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam remain closed.

Sanctuaries:	Closed areas applicable to platform gear are in effect. The Spring Creek Hatchery sanctuary is not necessary this time of year.

- The expected catch in the proposed fishery is 3,900 Chinook along with 150 steelhead and possibly a very small number of sockeye.
- The Zone 6 platform and hook and line fishery will be open for subsistence use in the summer and fall management periods and the tribes anticipate extending commercial sales of platform fish during these periods, but will bring these plans to the Compact at a later date.
- The Yakama Nation will allow commercial sale from Yakama Tributary Fisheries in the Wind River, Drano Lake, and the Klickitat River during their regularly scheduled openings.
