allowed to be sold after the period concludes. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool and sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools and may be kept for subsistence

purposes.

Gear:	Hook and line and/or platform gear identified in tribal rules.	
Allowable Sales:	Salmon (any species), steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be retained in fisheries downstream of Bonneville Dam. Sales of fish are not authorized on COE property downstream of Bonneville Dam. Fish must be transported elsewhere for sale. Fish landed during the open periods are allowed to be sold after the period concludes	
Additional:	Quick reporting required for all Washington Fish Buyers pursuant to WAC 220-352-180, and landings must be quick reported within 24-hours of completing the fish ticket. COE property at Bonneville Dam has no public trash service and fishers along with any other visitors need to remove any trash with them.

Area:	Wind River, Drano Lake and Klickitat River	
Gear:	Hoop Nets/Bag Nets, Dip Nets, and Rod and reel with hook and Line.	
	Gillnets may only be used in Drano Lake.	
Allowable	Salmon (any species), steelhead, shad, carp, catfish, walleye, bass, and yellow perch.	
Sales:	Sturgeon from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool tributaries may be	
	kept for subsistence. Sales of fish are allowed after the open period concludes, as long as the fish were landed during the open period.

	180, and landings must be quick reported within 24-hours of completing the fish
