Washington is one of the world's premier fishing locations.

That statement may sound ambitious given all the publicity around the federal Endangered Species Act protection being extended to some wild salmon, steelhead and bull trout species in Washington.

We are the first to admit much must be done--by everyone, fishers, and nonfishers alike--if we are going to pull those stocks back from the brink of extinction to a point where they are healthy. We want to restore them to a level where they provide harvests, cultural fulfillment and tribal needs.

We also have to be conservative in fisheries that target rockfish, lingcod and some other marine species.

But a wide variety of fishing opportunities still abound for Washington residents and out-of-state visitors.

WDFW operates one of the largest hatchery systems in the world. They produce some 210 million salmon and 8 million steelhead for western Washington and the Columbia River system. Approximately 2 million warmwater fish will be planted around the state. For example, eastern Washington lakes will receive 1.2 million walleye. Additionally, 2,500 tiger muskie, 190,000 largemouth bass, 200,000 crappie, 190,000 bluegill sunfish and 55,000 channel catfish will be divided between eastern and western Washington. Approximately 13 million trout and kokanee salmon were raised for lakes and streams on both sides of the Cascades.

These hatchery fish are raised to be caught. To create selective harvests of these fish, WDFW has spent millions of dollars to clip the adipose fins from millions of hatchery salmon so fishers can identify and keep them while releasing wild stocks. WDFW also clips its hatchery steelhead so they will provide exciting river fishing and delicious table fare.

New fishing opportunities also are being opened by placing large, hatchery surplus coho and steelhead in ponds and lakes. Some of those ponds are for juveniles only. Imagine the thrill for a young boy or girl hooking into an eight-pound coho.

In addition, millions of trout are planted in lowland lakes, for easy access by families. Volunteers pack many more to high mountain lakes to provide special fishing opportunities. Some lakes offer kokanee, or freshwater sockeye salmon.

For the trout fishing purist, WDFW manages some lakes and streams with special rules designed to provide high quality fishing experiences--and some large fish.

Of course Washington still offers angling opportunities for wild populations of trout, bass, crappie and other species in its lakes and rivers. For fishing excitement, anglers also should not forget the large sturgeon resident in the Columbia River system.

Partial to steamed butter clams or crab cakes? Washington also provides wonderful opportunities to fish for crab and shrimp, dig for butter and littleneck clams, collect oysters and to just walk beaches and inspect the incredible ecosystems of their tide pools.

From the Pacific Ocean to the alpine lakes of the Cascades to the Columbia River and lakes of eastern Washington, Washington is an angler's paradise. First check the rules in this pamphlet and then go and enjoy Washington's great fishing.

Sportfishing Rule Development for 2000-2001

This year's rule development cycle will be what we call a "major cycle" year. This means that rule change proposals will be accepted from both the public and the staff. Proposals for changes in salmon fisheries are dealt with with a different forum, and licensing changes require legislative action - however, any other type of rule proposal for sportfishing can become part of this process.

If you have participated before, or are on our mailing list, you will receive a mailout soon containing a rule proposal form and more detailed information about the process. If you haven't participated but would like to, you can call (360) 902-2700 or write to the Olympia office. You can also download a rule change proposal form from out website at <u>www.wa.gov/wdfw/</u>. Proposals will need to be returned to WDFW by early July to be considered in this year's process.

Pamphlet Improvement Process

Thanks to all of you who returned your pamphlet survey forms, or who submitted survey forms to the department's website. We received a total of 377 responses from staff and the public. Although this was not a scientific survey, we did learn a lot from your answers. Most of you think that the pamphlet is at least "fairly easy" to understand, with the Marine Area Rules being a little more difficult than the rest of the pamphlet. Most of you think that it's important to include maps and identification pictures in the pamphlet, and would like to identification pictures, especially to be of better quality. Most people felt that they can put up with advertisements in the pamphlet if they help pay for the cost of production.

Recently, we conducted another more scientific survey. This was a telephone survey of people who bought sportfishing licenses last year. We asked if they would prefer to have a separate doucment with only lake fishing rules available earlier (mid-February). This proposed "lakes pamphlet" would be published every other year, so lake rules would not be changed on the "off years." Of those who had an opinion, 69% preferred the two pamphlet option, with a separate pamphlet for lakes. We will take this idea to the Fish and Wildlife Commission meeting in mid-May to seek their guidance on how to proceed.

New for 1999

An area of major change this year is the new licensing structure that began January 1, 1999. Game fish and food fish licenses have been replaced by saltwater and freshwater licenses. A stewardship decal, which is free with your license is required for those using many of the Department's access sites. A hunting license is no longer required to harvest bullfrogs. See pages 8 and 9 for details or visit the Department's website at www.wa.gov/wdfw/.

This was a minor year for rule changes, which means we only accept proposals from staff, and we usually have one or two large issues that we attempt to address. This year the large issues were a statewide look at our sea-run cutthroat rules and finishing our revision of the rules for filleting fish in the field.

The rules for trout in saltwater have been changed to a statewide standard of catch and release only, except up to two hatchery steelhead may be retained. There are also numerous changes in rules for sea-run cuthroat in the lower Columbia region, and for Grays Harbor and Willapa Bay tributaries, Hood Canal tributaries, and a few north coastal and south sound streams. Be sure to check the individual stream listing before fishing for sea-runs.

Because of a change made by the legislature, we were able to include game fish in our new filleting rule. The rule states that fish with no size, weight or sex restrictions may be cleaned or filleted while in the field. Fish with such restrictions may be cleaned on the water, and filleted after they have been brought ashore and the angler has stopped fishing for the day. The exceptions to this rule are Dolly Varden/bull trout, sturgeon, salmon and steelhead, which must all be maintained so that the total length can be determined. Salmon and steelhead must also be kept so that all fins can be examined for determination of hatchery versus wild fish. However, all fish eccept Dolly Varden/bull trout and sturgeon may be prepared for immediate consumption in the field.

Some conservation concerns prompted rule changes for Pacific herring, eulachon, and lingcod. Portions of Marine Areas 6 and 7 have been closed to the taking of herring. The Washington portion of the Columbia River and its Washington tributaries have been closed to the taking of eulachon (also called Columbia River smelt), and the daily limit of lingcod has been changed from 3 to 2 in Marine Areas 1, 2, 3, and 4 west of the Bonilla/Tatoosh line. The upper Tucannon River has been closed to the taking of bull trout because of the "threatened" listing of these fish under Endangered Species Act.

Salmon seasons crafted during the Pacific Fishery Management Council and North of Falcon processes contain some new twists designed to allow anglers to harvest healthy hatchery stocks and minimize the harvest of troubled wild runs. Some of these include: "wild coho release" requiring anglers to release coho salmon with an adipose fin (wild fish) and allowing them to retain hatchery coho, and gear restrictions intended to let anglers harvest coho in some areas where chinook require protection (see rules for Marine Areas 9, 10, and 12). WDFW biologists and samplers will be closely monitoring catches and on the water enforcement patrols will work to prevent poaching of weak stocks.

Another major change for salmon fishers this year is that we are asking them <u>not</u> to return the heads of adipose marked coho salmon, unless requested to do so by a sampler. To allow for "wild coho release" fisheries, the majority of hatchery coho are now adipose marked, regardless of the presence of codedwire tag. WDFW samplers carry equipment to detect tags and will be collecting only the heads that actually carry a tag. Chinook heads, however should be returned as usual, and the monthly drawing for prize money will still take place.



Free Fishing Weekend

This Pamphlet is Effective

May 1, 1999 through April 30, 2000


The weekend corresponding with National Fishing Week has been declared "Free Fishing Weekend" in Washington. On this weekend, June 12-13, 1999 fishing licenses will not be required for food fish, shellfish and game fish. Catch record cards, which are free, are required. A Fish and Wildlife lands vehicle use permit is not required to use WDFW lands during Free Fishing Weekend.

These free fishing days are valid for everyone, regardless of residency or age. All other regulations remain in effect. Only waters open to fishing may be fished; lure and/or bait restrictions along with size and catch limits currently in place must be followed.

Fishing Contests

Any event where six or more people fish competitively for game fish and determine winners, regardless of the prize value, is defined as a fishing contest, and requires a permit from WDFW. For more information, or to request an application for a permit to conduct a fishing contest, contact WDFW's Freshwater Resources Division at (360) 902-2700. There is a \$24 fee for the permit.

Must be on your person while harvesting. Shellfish/Seaweed licenses must always be displayed on the outside of clothing while harvesting or transporting shellfish or seaweed.

The 2-Day License is not valid the first eight days of lowland lake season (beginning the last Saturday in April).

Disability Licenses

Persons of disability may apply to the Department to obtain a disabled harvester identification card and/or reduced fee identification card issued by the department. This card allows the harvester to obtain a disabled license from any license vendor. Along with the disabled license, the vendor will issue a



designated harvester identification card. The designated harvester card allows another licensed person to assist the disabled fisher in harvesting a daily limit of fish or shellfish. When fishing for food fish or game fish, the disabled fisher must be present and participating in the fishing activity. For shellfish, the disabled fisher need not be present at the site of harvest, but must be in the direct line of sight of the designated harvester. If this is not possible because of a physical obstruction or other barrier, the designated harvester and the disabled fisher must be within 1/4 mile of each other. Designated harvesters must keep the disabled fisher's harvest separate from their own.

Catch Record Cards

Catch Record Cards are an important management tool for estimating the recreational catch of some species. All Catch Record Cards are free with the purchase of the appropriate fishing license. Salmon, Sturgeon, Halibut and Steelhead Catch Record Cards are valid until the March 31 following issue and must be returned no later than June 30.

License Requirements



Big Changes in Licensing

Over the years, we heard from hundreds of hunters and anglers who were unsure about which licenses to buy. Many told us that is was too confusing to figure out what to buy, so they stopped buying anything at all. Increased costs may have led many of you to stop buying licenses also. In response, the agency has rewritten its entire licensing structure. Many, especially avid hunters and anglers, will see a reduction in license fees. We hope that lower fees and an easier-to-understand license structure will encourage more people to enjoy our state's hunting and fishing opportunities. This new structure took effect January 1, 1999. Major changes include.

- Elimination of separate enhancement fees. This was probably the most confusing part of the old licensing system. These fees will now be covered in our new licensing structure.
- The licensing year is shifting to April 1 through March 31. This change puts the license year more in line with hunting and fishing seasons.
- Fishing licenses are divided into three license options: Freshwater saltwater, and shellfish/ seaweed licenses.

Catch Record Cards

You may also need one or more of the following Catch Record Cards.

- 1. Salmon Catch Record Card (Good for 15 salmon) - A Salmon Catch Record Card is not required for landlocked salmon.
- Pacific Halibut Catch Record Card -Required for Pacific halibut in Marine Areas 5-13.
- 3. Sturgeon Catch Record Card (Good for 10 sturgeon) - Only one may be issued per season. A Sturgeon Catch Record Card is required in Grays Harbor, Willapa Bay, and Columbia-Snake River drainages, including all tributaries to these systems.
- Steelhead Catch Record Card (Good for 30 Steelhead) - Only one catch record card may be issued per season.

Saltwater License

The saltwater license allows the license holder to fish for any species existing in saltwater. This includes salmon, steelhead, sturgeon, halibut, rockfish, etc. Puget Sound Enhancement and Regional Fisheries Enhancement fees are also included.

Combination License

The combination license allows the license holder to participate in all three of the above activities.

Freshwater License

The freshwater license allows the license holder to fish for any species existing in freshwater. This includes salmon, steelhead, sturgeon, trout, bass, etc. Surcharges for the Warmwater Enhancement and Regional Fisheries Enhancement are included in the license fee.

Shellfish/Seaweed License

The shellfish/seaweed license structure remains the same and allows the holder to harvest crab, goose barnacles, mussels, octopus, oysters, razor clams, scallops, sea cucumbers, sea urchins, shrimp, softshell and hardshell clams, squid, and seaweed. There is a \$2 increase in the license fee.

There are three areas where anglers may legally fish with either a freshwater, saltwater, or combination license. These include Grays Harbor (Marine Area 2-2), Willapa Bay (Marine Area 2-1) and the Columbia River between a line from Rocky Point on the Washington shore to Tongue Point on the Oregon shore and the Buoy 10 line.

Access Stewardship Decals

Access Stewardship Decals are required to park a vehicle in many WDFW access areas, including lake and river access areas and wildlife areas. These decals are free with the purchase of a hunting or fishing license, or can be purchased separately from WDFW or any license vendor for \$10. Decal sales support the upkeep of these areas, keeping them clean, repaired and safe for your use.

Remember, if you see this sign at an access area, an Access Stewardship Decal is required to park there.



ANGLING (HOOK & LINE FISHING)

Fishing for personal use with a line attached to a pole capable of being held in hand while landing fish, or a handoperated line without a rod or reel.

BAIT

Anything that attracts fish or shellfish by scent and/or flavor. This includes any device made of feathers, hair, fiber, wood, metal, glass, cork, leather, rubber, or plastic which uses scent and/or flavoring to attract fish or wildlife.

BOW-AND-ARROW FISHING

Taking food fish with a line attached to an arrow and propelled by a bow.

CATCH-AND-RELEASE FISHING

A type of fishing where all of the fish caught are released back into the water alive.

CHUMMING

Scattering feed or other materials to attract fish to a location.

CLOSED WATERS

A body of water where fishing is prohibited.

DAILY LIMIT

The maximum number or pounds of fish, shellfish, or seaweed of a given species and size which a person may legally keep in a single day.

FLY

A lure on which thread, feathers, hackle, or yarn cover a minimum of half of the shank of the hook. Metallic colored tape, tinsel, mylar, or beadeyes may be used as an integral part of the design of the fly pattern.

FLY FISHING ONLY

In "Fly Fishing Only" waters an angler may use only the following tackle: a fly with a barbless single hook, hooks 1/2" or smaller when measured from point to shank, and a conventional fly line (other line may be used for backing and leader if it is attached to at least 25' of conventional fly line). An angler may not use the following: a fixed spool reel, weight attached to the leader or line, bait, or monofilament leader that has a breaking strength of more than twelve pounds.

FROZEN

Fish or shellfish that are hard frozen throughout.

FRESH

Fish or shellfish that are refrigerated, iced, salted, or surface glazed.

GAFFING

Attempting to take fish by impaling fish with a hook attached directly to a pole or other device.

HATCHERY

Means a fish missing an adipose fin or a ventral fin and haviing a healed scar at the location of the missing fin.

Ноок

BARBLESS

A hook from which all barbs have been deleted when manufactured, filed off, or pinched down.

A hook with a single point.




DOUBLE

A hook with two points on a common shank.

TREBLE -

A hook with three points on a common shank.



In the Field or In Transit

Anywhere other than at an ordinary residence. Dockside fish cleaning facilities, boat ramps, and cold storage lockers are considered in the field.

JUVENILE ONLY

Waters open for fishing only to youth under 15 years of age.

LANDLOCKED SALMON RULES

In landlocked waters, salmon are regulated as trout. Seasons, daily limits, and size restriction rules for landlocked salmon are identical to the game fish rules for trout in the same water. The angler's combined catch of salmon and trout applies toward the trout limit. A Catch Record Card is not required to retain landlocked salmon.

LENGTH

The shortest distance between the tip of the nose and the extreme tip of the tail, measured while the fish is laying on its side on a flat surface with its tail in a normal position.



LURE

A manufactured article constructed of feathers, hair, fiber, wood, metal, glass, cork, leather, rubber, or plastic which does not use scent and/or flavoring to attract fish.

MAXIMUM SIZE

The largest size of fish or shellfish that may be kept. For fish, the maximum size refers to the length.

Minimum Size

The smallest size of fish or shellfish that may be kept. For fish, the minimum size refers to the length.

Моитн

Unless otherwise defined, the mouth of a stream, river or slough is a line projected between the outermost uplands at the mouth. Outermost uplands are those lands not covered by water during ordinary high water.

NIGHT CLOSURE

Fishing is closed from one hour after official sunset to one hour before official sunrise.

NON-BUOYANT LURE

RESTRICTION

When a non-buoyant lure restriction is in effect, anglers may fish only with a buoyant lure (one that floats in fresh water) or a non-buoyant lure (one that sinks in fresh water) that contains only one single hook measuring 3/4" or less across from point to shank.



Ordinary Residence

A residential dwelling where a person normally lives, with associated features such as address, telephone number, utility account, etc. A motorhome or camper parked at a campsite are not considered to be an ordinary residence.

Possession Limit

The number of daily limits allowed to be kept in the field, or in transit.

PROCESSED

Fish or shellfish that have been subjected to heat (including kippering, smoking, canning, and boiling).

PUGET SOUND

All saltwater areas east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, outside the mouth of any river or stream, including the Strait of Juan de Fuca, Georgia Strait, Hood Canal, and all bays and inlets.

SELECTIVE GEAR RULES

Only unscented artificial flies or lures with a barbless single hook are allowed; bait is prohibited; fish may be released until the daily limit is retained. No one may fish from any floating device equipped with a motor, except where specifically allowed under Special Rules for individual waters. If any fish has swallowed the hook or is hooked in the gill, eye, or tongue, it should be kept if legal to do so.

CNAGGING

Attempting to take fish with a hook and line in such a way that the fish does not voluntarily take the hook(s) in its mouth.

Spear Fighing

Attempting to take fish by impaling the fish on a shaft, arrow, or other device.

WEIGHT

The weight of fish or shellfish before cleaning them and the wet weight for seaweed on which daily and possession pound limits are based.

Wild Coho Release

Wild coho may not be kept; only hatchery coho may be kept. Hatchery coho are identified by a missing adipose fin and a healed scar in the location of the missing fin.

WILD CUTTHROAT RELEASE


Wild cutthroat may not be kept; only hatchery cutthroat trout may be kept. Hatchery cutthroat trout are identified by a missing adipose fin and a healed scar in the location of the missing fin.

WILD STEELHEAD, CUTTHROAT OR COHO

Wild steelhead, cutthroat, or coho have intact adipose and ventral fins.

WILD STEELHEAD RELEASE

Wild steelhead may not be kept; only hatchery steelhead may be kept. Hatchery steelhead are identified by missing adipose or ventral fins and a healed scar in the location of the missing fin.



Fish and Shellfish Definitions

Adult Salmon

In freshwater, chinook 24" or more in length; coho 20" or more in length; and pink, chum, and sockeye salmon 12" or more in length are adults.

FORAGE FISH

Includes anchovy, sand lance, herring, sardine, and smelt.

BOTTOMFISH

Includes Pacific cod, Pacific tomcod, Pacific hake or whiting, walleye pollock, all species of dabs, sole and flounders (except Pacific halibut), lingcod and other species of greenling, ratfish, sablefish, cabezon, buffalo sculpin, great sculpin, red Irish lord, brown Irish lord, Pacific staghorn sculpin, wolfeel, giant wrymouth, plainfin midshipman, all species of shark, skate, rockfish, rattail, and surfperches excluding shiner perch.

Food Fish

Includes forage fish, halibut, bottomfish, common carp, shad, tuna, mackerel, salmon and sturgeon.

GAME FISH

Includes bass, burbot (freshwater ling), catfish, crappie, grayling, northern pikeminnow, peamouth chub, yellow perch, northern pike, tiger musky, sucker, sunfish, trout (including steelhead), landlocked chinook, and coho salmon, walleye and whitefish.

Salmon

Includes chinook, coho, pink, chum, sockeye and Atlantic salmon.

JACK **SALMON**

Male chinook and coho salmon that return at a younger age than most members of their species. For freshwater rules, a jack salmon is a chinook less than 24" in length or a coho less than 20" in length.

KOKANEE

Freshwater resident sockeye salmon, also called silver trout. Where the searun (sockeye) and the resident (kokanee) forms occur together, refer to the Freshwater Special Rules for the size differences between kokanee and sockeye.

SEAWEED

Marine species of algae, such as kelp, rock weed, and sea lettuce.

CHELLFISH

Includes crab, razor clams, softshell and hardshell clams, oysters, all shrimp, sea cucumbers, sea urchins, abalone, scallops, goose barnacles, cockles, mussels, squid, octopus, and crawfish.

STEELHEAD

A sea-run rainbow trout over 20" in length.

TROUT

Includes rainbow trout, steelhead, brook, brown, cutthroat, bull trout/Dolly Varden, golden, lake and kokanee (silver trout).



Statewide General Rules

Harvest Rules

You May Not:

Fish in closed waters.

Possess fish or shellfish that do not meet the minimum and maximum size limits, weight limits, or sex restrictions, or in excess of the daily or possession limit.

Intentionally waste game fish, food fish or shellfish.

Remove eggs from salmon or sturgeon without keeping the body of the fish.

Use salmon, herring, or halibut for anything other than human consumption or fishing bait.

Possess or use live fish for game fish bait.

Fish for personal use from a boat being used for commercial fishing.

Fish for or harass game fish or food fish within 400 feet downstream of a man-made dam, fish ladder, or other obstruction or in rearing, holding, or passage facilities.

Harvest any part of another person's daily limit, except as provided for under disability license.

Continue to fish for salmon after the daily limit (marine waters) or adult portion of the daily limit (freshwater) has been retained.

Fish and Shellfish Caught in Canada

If you are transporting Canadian-caught fish or shellfish into a Washington port, you must possess a Canadian license, and if required, a Canadian catch record. Shellfish or food fish other than salmon taken from Canadian waters must comply with Canadian sport fishing rules. You may not stop to fish in Washington waters if transporting Canadiancaught fish or shellfish that do not meet Washington fishing regulations.

All salmon caught in Canada and landed at Washington ports must meet the restrictions in place for the port where landed at the time of the landing, including both daily and size limits. If the adjacent waters are closed, no landing of fresh salmon is allowed. You may not land both a Canadian and a Washington limit of salmon on the same day (one or the other, but not both).

Violations of State Laws

Gear Rules

You May Not:

Use drugs, explosives, or poison that may kill or injure fish and wildlife.

Snag or attempt to snag fish.

Use more than one line with up to three hooks while fishing, except that (1) a second line using baitfish jigger gear is lawful while fishing in Marine Areas 5-13 and (2) not more than two hooks may be used when fishing for bottomfish or halibut.

Fish with a rod not under your immediate control.

Use a net, except to land legally-hooked fish.

Fish for salmon, sturgeon, octopus or crab in saltwater with underwater spearfishing gear.

Fish for game fish, salmon, shad, sturgeon, or shellfish with bow and arrow or spear.

Chum (broadcast feed) to attract game fish unless authorized by Special Rules.

Use a gaff hook, except to land legally hooked halibut, tuna or dogfish shark.

You are Required to:

Cooperate with data collection or other sampling of foodfish, gamefish, shellfish or seaweed upon request of Department of Fish and Wildlife personnel. This includes relinquishing any part of a salmon, steelhead, or other species of fish containing coded-wire tags.

Stop at mandatory check stations established by the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Show fish, shellfish, and seaweed in your possession and required licenses, catch record cards, and gear being used upon request of a Fish and Wildlife officer.

Fill out your Catch Record Card immediately upon retaining salmon, steelhead, halibut or sturgeon.

Possession Rules

You May Not:

Fish for or harvest fish or shellfish in an area with catch in your possession that does not meet the regulations of that area. You may, however, pass through such an area without stopping to fish.

Possess another person's game fish unless it is accompanied by a statement showing the name, address, license and tag number, date, county, and area where it was taken, and the signature of the angler who harvested it.

Hold recreationally-caught food fish, game fish, or shellfish in storage by a custom canner, hotel or restaurant, or a cold storage plant without tags listing the name and address of its owner.

Filleting Rules

Fish with no size, weight, or sex restriction may be cleaned or filleted while in the field. If such a restriction exists, fishers may clean their catch on the water, and may fillet their catch once they have come ashore and have finished fishing for the day. Dolly Varden/bull trout and sturgeon must be maintained in such condition that the total length can be determined. Salmon and steelhead must be maintained so that the total length can be determined and fins can be examined (to determine hatchery versus wild fish). However, all fish and shellfish, except Dolly Varden/bull trout and sturgeon may be prepared for immediate consumption and consumed in the field.

Buying Treaty Indian Caught Fish

In order to buy, sell or possess steelhead, sea-run cutthroat, or Dolly Varden/bull trout lawfully taken by a treaty Indian, a person must meet the following requirement: the fish must be accompanied by a written statement showing taker's name, address, tribal affiliation, and treaty fish identification card number, number of fish, date and location where taken. This rule does not apply to treaty Indians nor to game fish purchased from a fish buyer licensed by the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Marine Area Rules ¹

Rules listed on this page are general rules. Specific exceptions to these rules are listed by area.

••••• Season and Daily Hours:

Fishing for fin fish is CLOSED in marine waters unless a season is specifically authorized for a species under the Marine Area Rules. During an open season, marine waters are open 24 hours per day, except as noted for night closures.

•••• Quota Management:

SALMON and HALIBUT are managed by quotas in some marine areas. These fisheries close when the quotas have been taken. Closures will be announced to local news media and included in the sportfishing hotline telephone message.

• Regulation Changes:

Conditions may arise which will require changes in regulations. These changes will be announced to local news media and included in the Fishing Hotline or Shelfish Rule Change Hotline message and the Department's website. Any emergency change will supersede regulations printed in this pamphlet.

Lawful Fishing Tackle General

HOOK AND LINE ANGLING unless noted differently in Species Rules, only one line with up to 3 hooks; hooks may be barbed or barbless.

ALL FISHING GEAR - Must be kept in immediate control and gear may not be left unattended while fishing.

LANDING A FISH - A club or dipnet may be used to assist landing a legal fish taken by legal gear. A gaff may only be used to land a legally hooked halibut, tuna, or dogfish shark.

DOWNRIGGERS - May be used with a line if the line releases from the downrigger while playing and landing the fish.

RODHOLDERS - May be used; the rod must be easily removed without delay; rod may be left in the holder while playing the fish.

ELECTRIC REELS - May be used if designed for sport fishing and attached to a fishing rod.

SPEARFISHING - The diver must be swimming or floating in the water while spearfishing. The use of explosives or bullets attached to the spear ("bang sticks") is prohibited.

Species Rules

STEELHEAD may be caught and released while using bait until the daily limit is retained. When lures or flies are used voluntarily, fish may be released until the daily limit is retained. If fish has swallowed the hook or is hooked in the gill, eye, or tongue, it should be kept if legal to do so.

SALMON - Barbless hooks only except barbed hooks may be used while fishing from the Columbia River North Jetty after Aug. 1. Only single-point hooks and a hand-held rod and line may be used in Areas 1-4. Handheld line is legal in other saltwater areas.

STURGEON - Single-point barbless hooks are required. Lures are not allowed.

HALIBUT - Hook and line angling and spearfishing only. A hand-held line is permitted. Only one line with up to two hooks may be used. Halibut may be shot while landing with a gaff or dip net.

BOTTOMFISH, TUNA AND MACKEREL -

Hook and line angling, spearfishing and bow and arrow fishing only. Only one line with up to <u>two</u> hooks may be used for BOTTOMFISH.

FORAGE FISH - Forage fish jig or dipnet only. Dipnet gear must not exceed 36" across the bag frame. Holders of disability license may use a dip net with a hand-operated gate. Jig gear may have up to three treble hooks or nine single hooks, not to exceed 3/8" gap between point and shank. While fishing for FOOD FISH in Areas 5-13, a second line using forage fish jig gear may be used to fish for FORAGE FISH.

Possession Limits

SALMON - Two daily limits of fresh SALMON. An additional 40 pounds of SALMON may be possessed in a frozen or processed form.

TROUT - Two daily limits of hatchery STEELHEAD.

STURGEON - Two daily limits in any form. Annual limit 10.

BOTTOMFISH - Two daily limits in any form.


HALIBUT - Two daily limits in any form, except only one limit while aboard the fishing vessel.

TUNA AND MACKEREL - No possession limit.

SHELLFISH - One daily limit of fresh SHELLFISH. Additional SHELLFISH may be possessed in a frozen or processed form.

FORAGE FISH - (herring, anchovies, sardines, sand lance and smelt) two daily limits in fresh form. Additional forage fish may be possessed in frozen or processed form.

- 1. ILWACO west of the Buoy 10 line at the Columbia River mouth, north to Leadbetter Point.
- 2. WESTPORT-OCEAN SHORES from Leadbetter Point north to the Queets River, excluding Willapa Bay and Grays Harbor.
- 2-1. WILLAPA BAY east of a line from Leadbetter Point to Buoy 8 and then to Cape Shoalwater.
- 2-2. GRAYS HARBOR east of a line from the tip of the North Jetty to exposed end of the South Jetty.

- 4. NEAH BAY from Cape Alava north and inside Juan de Fuca Strait to the Sekiu River.

Buoy 10 Line: The "Buoy 10 line" is defined as a true north and south line projected through Buoy 10, which marks the channel leading into the Columbia River at its mouth (a line from the Lewis and Clark Interpretive Center atop Cape Disappointment Rock through Buoy 10 to the South Jetty).

See Columbia River listing in Eastside Rivers for Buoy 10 season.

Control Zone 1: Waters encompassed by a line extending 6 nautical miles due west from North Head along 46° 18' N. latitude to 124° 13' 18" W. longitude, then south along a line bearing 167° true to a point at 46° 11' 6" N. latitude and 124° 11' 0" W. longitude (Columbia River Buoy), then northeast along the line of red buoys to the tip of the South Jetty and west of the Buoy 10 line. Waters of the control zone are CLOSED to fishing for SALMON except as allowed while fishing from the North Jetty.

Columbia River North Jetty: The jetty is open to SALMON fishing 7 days a week when the Buoy 10 or the Marine Area 1 SALMON fishery is open. Barbed hooks allowed.

Chinook Salmon

Chinook salmon have small, irregular spots on the entire tail and the back. The gums of chinook salmon are black at the base of the teeth.



Coho Salmon

Coho salmon have small, irregular spots on the upper half of the tail The gums of coho salmon are white at the base of the teeth.



Chum Salmon

Chum salmon are generally the largest of the Pacific salmon that lack black spots on the body and tail. During ocean migration chum are often silvery bright with signs of green pigmentation on the head and back appearing as the fish approaches maturity.



Pink Salmon

Pink salmon have large oblong spots on the back and the entire tail. The scales of the pink salmon are small compared to those of the other Pacific salmon species.



Sockeye Salmon

Sockeye salmon are sleek and silvery with blue-black top of the head and silvery white jaws. There are no distinct black spots on the tail or back.

Atlantic Salmon (not pictured) - Atlantic salmon have irregular spots on the upper half of the body and some below the lateral line. 1-3 large black spots on the gill covers identify this fish from other Pacific salmon species. 16

Chinook Salmon

Chinook Salmon do not display the conspicuous morphological changes of pink, chum and sockeye salmon during the spawning stage. Typically, Pacific salmon turn from the silvery bright ocean coloration to a darker color as they approach spawning. Chinook are often the largest of the Pacific salmon, and the large size is characteristic in mature fish.



Coho Salmon

In mature male coho salmon, the upper jaw forms an elongated hooked snout and the teeth become greatly enlarged. The spawning color of the male is generally brighter than that of the female and is characterized by the dorsal surface and head turning bluish-green. The sides of the males develop a broad red streak. In females, the jaws also elongate but the development is



Chum Salmon

Chum salmon display characteristic olive-green and purple (calico) vertical bars on the sides of the body as they approach the spawning phase. Both males and females develop hooked noses and large canine-like teeth, although the males characteristics are more pronounced.



Pink Salmon

As male pink salmon begin to enter the spawning phase, they develop a prominent hump in front of the dorsal fin like that of the male sockeye salmon. Males develop a characteristic elongated snout and large teeth. Body color in both males and female darkens from a bright silvery appearance to a pale slate, brownish, or greenish-gray on the back and sides and a pale whitish color below. Small, oblong irregular black spots are present on the back and sides, and/on the dorsal and tail fins.

Sockeve Salmon

Sockeye salmon turn bright red on their body, and olive-green on the head as they begin to enter the spawning phase of their life. Males of this species develop a prominent hump in front of the dorsal fin. Also, the male's snout becomes elogated and canine-like teeth grow out of the receding gums. Females undergo distinct color change but retain their body shape.



Atlantic salmon have large black spots on the gill covers and back, with rarely any spots on the tail fin. Their scales are large, there is no red stripe along the lateral line and they have 8-10 anal fin rays. Atlantic salmon may be taken from marine waters during any open salmon season, and from anadromous (not landlocked) freshwater during any open salmon or trout season. Anglers may not, however, continue to fish for Atlantic salmon after a daily limit of another species of salmon has been retained. In landlocked lakes, Atlantic salmon may be taken as part of the trout daily limit. Seasons and size limits in place for trout apply to Atlantic salmon in landlocked lakes. Opportunities to harvest Atlantic salmon beyond those listed in the pamphlet will be announced to the news media and carried on WDFW's recreational fishing hot line.

Coho and Chinook Salmon Identification




Coho salmon have white gums on the lower jaw. The tail is square and may have spots on the upper half.






The chinook has black gums and a dark mouth. The tail is v-shaped, with circular black spots.



Wild Coho Release

In order to provide coho salmon fishing opportunity, WDFW and the Tribes have marked some coho salmon by clipping the adipose fin (a small fatty fin directly behind the dorsal fin). In areas designated "wild coho release", fin clipped coho salmon are the only coho that may be retained. The picture to the right shows a wild coho salmon and a fin clipped or hatchery coho salmon. Please be careful in releasing wild coho – they are your fishing future! For tips on the best way to release fish, please see page 23.

WDFW Tagging

The Department of Fish and Wildlife has released several million chinook salmon with microscopic wire tags implanted in their heads and adipose fins removed. Each tagged head returned qualifies the angler for participation in a monthly drawing. Each month, \$1,000 is given away: one \$100 first prize, two \$50 second prizes, and 40 third prizes of \$20 each.

Coho salmon, however, will be treated differently this year. Please do not return the heads of adipose marked coho salmon, unless requested to do so by a sampler. To allow for "wild coho release" fisheries, the majority of hatchery coho are now adipose marked, regardless of the presence of a coded-wire tag. WDFW samplers carry equipment to detect tags and will be collecting only the heads that actually carry a tag.

How to Release Fish

When you need to release a fish there are some special precautions you can take to give it a good chance of surviving.

- Minimize your handling of the fish. Leave the fish in the water if at all possible. Wiping the slime or scales off a fish reduces its chance of survival by making it more likely to pick up a skin infection.
- Do not net your fish if you can avoid it. If you must use a net, use one with a cotton mesh it's less abrasive to the fish's skin.
- Use a hook remover to take out hooks imbedded in the mouth or jaw.
- If a fish has swallowed the hook, cut your leader. The hook will rust out and do less damage than it would if you pulled it out.
- Keep your fingers away from the eyes and gills of the fish.
- If you've removed the fish from the water, get it back in as soon as possible. Carefully revive the fish if it appears exhausted.










Marine Area 6 Map





Marine Area 8-2 Map







Size: up to 15" Color: blue stripes on back. Look for: bright color pattern.







Check the Beach List to determine if a beach is open, or if there are health restrictions.

• • Marine Toxin Levels:

• • • • Areas Listed on Biotoxin Hotline:

In areas listed as closed on the Biotoxin Hotline, also avoid taking other shellfish which eat clams (such as moon snails or hairy tritons).

••••• Rule Change Information:

Conditions may arise which require sudden changes in regulations. These changes will be announced to local news media and included on the **Shellfish Rule Change Hotline (360) 796-3215.**

Safe Handling Practices

- Water color <u>does not</u> indicate shellfish safety.
- Rinse your catch in salt (not fresh) water. Quickly cool your catch on ice or in a refrigerator and cook as soon as possible.
- Wash all seaweed before eating.
- Cook shellfish adequately before eating. This does not destroy biotoxins, but can help prevent illness caused by naturally occurring bacteria or bacteria caused by pollution.
- Cooking, rinsing, or freezing does not destroy biotoxins. Crab can also concentrate biotoxins in their internal organs. Clean crabs before cooking. Eat only the meat. Eating shellfish with high concentrations of biotoxins may cause illness or death!

Possession Limit

One daily limit in fresh form. Additional shellfish may be possessed in frozen or processed form.

Shellfish Enhancement

Some beaches have increased harvest opportunity as a result of WDFW enhancement activities. Harvest is encouraged within these areas, which are marked with signs attached to yellow posts.

Marine Toxins & Pollution

Shellfish or seaweed may be contaminated from exposure to bacteria, biotoxins, viruses, or chemicals. Consumption of contaminated shellfish or seaweed can pose a health risk to humans. One potential biotoxin is Paralytic Shellfish Poisoning (PSP) also called "red tide." PSP becomes a problem when clams, oysters, scallops, mussels, or other shellfish consume and concentrate a microscopic algae which contains a potentially lethal biotoxin. Symptoms include numbness of the tongue and lips and tingling in the extremities and fingertips. This may be followed by loss of muscular control and difficulty in breathing. Amnesic Shellfish Poisoning (ASP) results when shellfish concentrate a different biotoxin called domoic acid. Symptoms of ASP include abdominal cramps, diarrhea, vomiting, disorientation, dizziness, and memory loss. If any of these symptoms occur after eating shellfish, get immediate medical attention.

Tideland Ownership

Most Puget Sound and Hood Canal beaches are privately owned. Shellfish/seaweed may not be taken from private beaches without the owner's or lessee's permission. When harvesting from public beaches, remain within the public beach boundaries. Private tideland owners and lessees, and members of their immediate family (grandparents, parents, spouse, siblings, children, and grandchildren) are exempt from personal use daily limits and shellfish licenses when taking clams, oysters, and mussels harvested for their own personal use from their own tidelands. Daily limits apply for all other shellfish, all other people, and all other beaches. Everyone harvesting large quantities of shellfish for commercial purposes needs a shellfish certification from the Department of Health (see RCW 69.30.010(8)). Tideland owners should contact Fish and Wildlife Enforcement or Department of Health for specific rules.

License

A Shellfish/Seaweed License is required for all shellfish (except crawfish) and all seaweed harvest and must be displayed on the outside of clothing during shellfish harvest and transport. See License Requirements, page 9. Everyone claiming a limit must actively participate in the harvesting unless they possess a disability license.

Pacific Razor Clams Siliqua patula



Grows to 6"; fragile, thin elongated shells are covered with shiny, tan periostracum (skin). Found only on Pacific coastal beaches.


Razor clam sanctuaries (Reserves) are 1/4 mile sections of coastal ocean beaches located on three beach areas that are used to assist in the management of the razor clam resource. The three areas are marked with large metal or wooden posts and are adequately signed to designate a no-digging area. Sampling occurs on a continuing basis for various population studies and comparisons with harvested areas. The three areas are:

PERMANENT RAZOR CLAM RESERVE CLOSURES (Areas marked with posts)

Copalis Beach - from a point 4/10 of a mile south of the Ocean City approach (2nd Ave.) and extending south for 1/4 mile.

Twin Harbors Beach - from the middle of the County Line Road Approach south for 1/4 mile.

Long Beach - from the middle of the Oysterville approach north for 1/4 mile.

Manila littleneck clam Tapes philippinarum

Average size is 1-2", up to 2-1/2". Oblong shell has concentric and radiating lines. May have colored, patterned shells. Found to 4" below surface.



Cockle clam Clinocardium nuttallii

Prominent, evenly-spaced ridges which fan out from the hinge. Mottled, light brown. Can grow to 5". Found just below surface.




Native littleneck clam Protothaca staminea

Average size is 1-2", up to 2-1/2". Rounded shell has concentric and radiating lines. Found 6-10" below surface.



Butter clam Saxidomus giganteus

Average size is 3-4", up to 6". Shells are usually chalky-white with no radiating ridges. The siphon can be pulled into its shell. Usually found 12-18" below surface.







Spot shrimp (*Pandalus platyceros*) are distinguished by four white spots on the body. All Areas, except Hood Canal and Port Angeles Harbor, have a 1-3/16" minimum size limit, measured from the base of the eyestalk to the top rear edge of the carapace. Spot shrimp may reach 10" in total length.

Pink Shrimp

Pink shrimp (*Pandalus eous and P. jordani*) are small (less than 6") and uniformly pink.

Coonstripe (Dock) Shrimp



Coonstripe or dock shrimp (*Pandalus danae*) are brownish in color with brown lines and spots on the head and tail. This species may grow to 5-1/2" in length.

Coonstripe (Humpback) Shrimp



The coonstripe or humpback shrimp (*Pandalus hypsinotus*) is mottled reddish-brown with some white patches on the head and tail. This species may reach $7-1/2^{"}$ in length.

Statewide Gear Rules - Crab, Shrimp, and Crawfish



Caution

Sportfishing rules for crab, shrimp and crawfish are subject to change based on tribal negotiations. Check the Shellfish Rule Change Hotline or watch your local media for potential changes. See pages 47, 49 and 50 for seasons and other harvest rules.

One star trap, one ring net, or one pot is considered one unit of gear. The maximum number of units of gear that may be fished per person is:

Puget Sound except Hood Canal: Hood Canal (during shrimp season):	Four units, two for crab and two for shrimp No more than one shrimp pot and a total of two ring nets or star traps for crab
Hood Canal (remainder of year):	Two units of crab gear
Coastal waters:	Two units total
All freshwater areas:	Two units for crawfish

Every shellfish pot, ring net, or star trap left unattended in Washington waters must have its own buoy line and a separate buoy that is permanently and legibly marked with the operator's first name, last name, and permanent address (telephone number is voluntary). Only one name and address may appear on a buoy. Buoys must be weighted sufficiently to prevent the line from floating on the surface.

Buoys must be:

- Constructed of durable material (no bleach, antifreeze, ro detergent bottles, paint cans, etc.).
- Visible on the surface at all times except during extreme tidal conditions.
- Half red and half white for crab (both colors should be displayed when in floating position). Yellow for shrimp. The personal marker flag and and staff, if attached, may be any color.

It is illegal to pull an unattended shellfish pot, ring net, or star trap with a buoy that does not have your name on it. However, any fisher may assist the person whose name is on the buoy while he or she is pulling the pot.

All parts of ring nets and star traps must lie flat on the sea bottom and not restrict free movement of crab until lifted. Shellfish pots must be covered by water at all times while being fished. Crab pots, star traps and ring nets may not be set or tended at night (one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise).

All crab, shrimp, and crawfish pots must be equipped with a biodegradable device consisting of either:

- (1) securing the pot lid hook or tiedown strap with a single loop of cord; or
- (2) sewing a 3" by 5" escape panel in the upper half of pot closed with cord; or
- (3) attaching the pot lid or one pot side (serving as a pot lid) with no more than three single loops of cord.

Cord used must be untreated 100% cotton or other natural fiber no larger than thread size 120 or 1/8-inch. This cord, when attached as described above, must be able to rot away and allow crab, shrimp, crawfish, and fish to escape freely if the pot is lost. All crab pots must have two 4-1/4-inch minimum inside diameter escape rings in the upper half of the pot. Shrimp pots must not exceed 10 ft. in perimeter, maximum height 18 inches.


ADDITIONAL RULES FOR HOOD CANAL (Marine Area 12)

SHRIMP POT: Pots must be constructed of mesh material, except for the entrance tunnels, and must allow a 7/8" square peg to pass through each mesh without changing the shape of the mesh opening (no liners allowed). See the diagram below.

Tunnels must enter from the sides of the pot, and may be made of any size mesh material. The sum of the maximum tunnel widths must not exceed one-half the perimeter of the bottom of the pot.

LOST GEAR

Do not attempt to salvage lost shellfish gear from Hood Canal without first obtaining a permit from the Department of Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Program. Call (360) 902-2936.

How to Use Freshwater Rules

••••••• Read:

The Statewide General Freshwater Rules. Determine seasons and general rules applying to game fish or food fish you intend to fish.

•• Choose:

The location you are going to fish and check that area for Special Rule listings. Special Rules are divided into four areas: Westside Rivers, Westside Lakes, Eastside Rivers and Eastside lakes. RIVERS lists rivers, streams and beaver ponds. LAKES lists lakes, ponds, and reservoirs. All COLUMBIA RIVER special rules are listed in the EASTSIDE RIVERS section. See map below for additional infomation.

• If your area is listed in a Special Rules section:

Read Special Rules Instructions on bottom of page 53. If your area is NOT listed in the Special Rules then the Statewide General Freshwater Rules apply.

4••••••• The following terms are used frequently in the Special Rules:

Catch and Release, Chumming, Daily Limit, Fly Fishing Only, Juvenile Only, Landlocked Salmon Rules, Length, Maximum Size, Minimum Size, Night Closure, Non-Buoyant Lure Restriction, Selective Gear Rules, Wild Cutthroat Release, Wild Steelhead Release. Definitions can be found on pages 10 and 11.



Statewide General Freshwater Rules

Tackle

Hook and line angling only. Barbed or barbless hooks may be used, and a hook may be single, double, or treble, but not more than one line with up to three hooks per angler.

Single pointed barbless hooks are required in areas designated as "fly fishing only" or "selective gear rules," and while fishing for STURGEON.

All fishing gear must be kept in immediate control and may not be left unattended while fishing. Rodholders may be used; the rod must be easily removed without delay; rod may be left in holder while playing the fish. Downriggers may be used if the line releases from the downrigger while playing and landing the fish.

A club or dipnet may be used to assist landing a legal fish taken by legal gear. A gaff hook may not be used.

It is unlawful to chum or broadcast any substance to attract game fish, unless specifically authorized by Special Rules.

Where use of bait is prohibited, or where lures or flies are used voluntarily, fish may be caught and released until the daily limit is retained. If any fish has swallowed the hook or is hooked in the gill, eye, or tongue, it should be kept if legal to do so.

Seasons

The following rules and seasons apply <u>unless</u> listed otherwise in the Special Rules (page 55-118). Freshwater areas are open 24 hours

per day when open.




LAKES, PONDS AND RESERVOIRS not listed in the

SPECIAL RULES are open to fishing for GAME FISH (except Dolly Varden/ Bull Trout and grass carp) YEAR-ROUND.



RIVERS, STREAMS AND BEAVER PONDS not listed in the SPECIAL RULES are open to fishing for GAME FISH (except

Dolly Varden/Bull Trout and grass carp) JUNE 1-OCTOBER 31.



ALL FRESHWATER AREAS not listed in the SPECIAL RULES are open year-round to fishing for

STURGEON, COMMON CARP, SHAD AND SMELT and CLOSED to fishing for SALMON, DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT and GRASS CARP.

* All SALMON seasons within Grays Harbor and its tributaries subject to change based on outcome of state/tribal agreement.

Sturgeon

STURGEON Catch Record Card required in Grays Harbor and Willapa Bay and Columbia-Snake River drainages, including all tributaries to these systems. Return STURGEON Catch Record Card by June 30. Annual STURGEON limit is 10 fish.

Single-pointed barbless hooks and bait are required to fish for STURGEON. Immediately release any STURGEON not to be retained. STURGEON fishing is not allowed at night.

In the field, it is unlawful to possess any STURGEON from which the head or tail have been removed, and eggs must be retained with carcass of fish from which they came.

TAGGED STURGEON: Do not remove tags from fish not of legal size or that will not be retained, but record: tag number and color, date and location of catch, fish length, your name and address. If fish is retained, remove tag and send with above information to WDFW Columbia River office.

For STURGEON RULES in the Columbia and Snake River tributaries above Bonneville Dam, see rules for adjoining mainstem waters.

Special Rules Instructions

The Special Rules sections list all freshwater areas where the Statewide General Freshwater Rules have been modified.

Statewide rules remain in effect throughout the Special Rules section, unless otherwise specified.

For all game fish and SALMON the Special Rules show all of the fishing opportunity for each area listed.

In the Special Rules sections **Statewide rules** means the statewide rules apply for minimum size and daily limit. The terms **All Game Fish** and **Other Game Fish** include the Game Fish species on page 9, except DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT and GRASS CARP.



EULACHON (Columbia River smelt) may not be retained in the Columbia River or its tributaries. The term TROUT includes: BROWN, CUTTHROAT, RAINBOW, LAKE, GOLDEN and EASTERN BROOK TROUT; KOKANEE; LANDLOCKED ATLANTIC, COHO, AND CHINOOK SALMON; AND STEELHEAD.

County references after lakes or streams are there to make it easier to locate the waters listed, or to differentiate between two places with the same name. They do not mean that the rules apply only to the portion of water in that county.

References in the Special Rules to "internal combution engines prohibited" or "use of motors prohibited" refer to rules you must follow when fishing is your primary activity.

Wild STEELHEAD may only be kept where specifically authorized in the Special Rules. For SMELT, COMMON CARP, SHAD, and STURGEON, the Statewide Rules apply unless one of these four species is listed in the Special Rules.

In the Special Rules, all seasons for named lakes in Grant and Adams counties apply to inlet and outlet streams. In Grant, Adams, Franklin, Okanogan and Douglas counties, you may fish up to the base of all man-made dams or other obstructions, (in listed and unlisted areas), except Zosel Dam.

An "open" listing does not authorize anglers to trespass on private property (which often includes the bed of the stream) or reservation lands. Please respect reservation boundaries and contact the affected tribe before entering reservation lands or waters.

Selected Washington Game Fish



Rainbow Trout

Body color is variable and may be silvery in lakes and reservoirs. It has a red to pink streak on its side and irregular spotting. There are no teeth on the back of the tongue.



Cutthroat Trout

Body color is variable. The maxillary (upper jaw bone) usually extends beyond the margin of the eye. The hyoid teeth are behind the tongue. There may be a red or orange slash on the underside of the jaw. Spotting is more closely grouped toward the tail. Sea-run coastal cutthroat return in fall after one year in an estuary.



Golden Trout

Coloration is brilliant and distinct with a green back and gold-toned sides. There are a few spots below mid-point of the body and white tips on the dorsal, anal and pelvic fins. Parr marks show on the side of the body.



Lake Trout (Mackinaw)

Dark gray or gray green above with a light gray to white belly. Colored spots are absent, fins have small white borders, and the tail is forked. It inhabits large, deep lakes,



Kokanee (Silver Trout)

It's back is greenish blue to silver with faint speckling. The sides and belly are silvery with no distinct spotting. When kokanee spawn in fall, their sides turn red to scarlet. The inside of the mouth is white, not black as in some salmon.



Steelhead (Female)

Steelhead are ocean-run rainbow which run in both summer and winter seasons, returning after one to three years at sea.



Brown Trout

This trout's back is brown or olive with large spots. Sides are light brown to vellowish with large dark spots surrounded by halos of blue-gray. The tail has few spots.



Brook Trout

Dark green or blue with white belly, it's upper body and dorsal fin have wormlike markings. It's sides have yellow and pink spots with blue rings. The lower fins are white-tipped and the tail is square.



Dolly Varden/Bull Trout

This fish is olive green to brown above and on the sides with no wormlike markings. There are cream or crimson spots. The tail is slightly forked. Dolly Varden are a sea-run version, more silvery in color, and spend one year in an estuary. Bull trout are found in Eastern and Western Washington, usually in larger reservoirs.



Coloration is light gravish-blue on black with silvery sides and a dull. whitish belly. It has large scales, and a small mouth without teeth.

Selected Washington Game Fish



Largemouth Bass

This bass is dark green on the back and sides, with a dark, horizontal band along its sides. The belly is white. The large jaw, when closed, extends behind the eye.



Bluegill

The bluegill is olive green to bluish with a blue and orange lower body. It has vertical bars on each side and solid black gill opercular lobes.



Yellow Perch

This perch has a greenish to yellow body, a white belly, and vertical dark crossbars on each side. There are no prominent teeth.



Bullhead

The body is darkish-black to brown. It's head is not as flat as a channel catfish. The cat-like barbels on it's mouth are brown or yellow. The skin has no scales, there are no spots on the side, and the tail is not forked.

Smallmouth Bass

This bass is dark olive to brown on the back, with a white belly. The sides are bronze and have dark vertical bands. The small jaw does not extend behind the eves.

Walleye

Coloration is black to brown on a whitish background. The lower portion of the tail fin is also whilish. It has a dark spot on the first dorsal fin, but no strong cross bars on the sides. The teeth are elongated.



Crappie

The body is silvery, with dark spots. The fins have dark bands. White crappie may have vertical bars on the sides.



Channel Catfish

The body goes from blackish to silvery to white on the sides. There may be some small irregular spots on the sides. It's skin lacks scales. It has cat-like black barbels on the mouth and jaw. a flat head and forked tail.
