



Summary of 2022 Northern Pike Suppression Results on Boundary Reservoir, Pend Oreille River, WA.

In 2022, a total of 88 nets were deployed and 40 Northern Pike (NP) removed between March 7 and April 19, with a final catch-per-unit-effort (CPUE) of 0.45 NP/net-night. In total, 825 NP have been removed since mechanical suppression effort began in Boundary Reservoir in 2016. The Kalispel Natural Resources Department collected 6 Northern Pike during the 2022 Spring Pike Index Netting (SPIN) Survey conducted May 9 through May 11. The resulting CPUE of 0.20 (\pm 0.17) NP/net-night in sloughs and mainstem river between Box Canyon Dam and Metaline Falls met the \leq 0.50 NP/net-night target for the reservoir.

Mechanical Removal:

- Netting took place from March 7 to April 19
- > Netting locations were concentrated from Box Canyon Dam to Metaline Falls, with lesser effort applied from Metaline Falls to Boundary Dam
- Collected biological information such as weight, length, sex, and maturity on all Northern Pike
- > Total nets deployed: 88
- Overall CPUE: 0.42 NP/net-night

Northern Pike catch summary (Table 1):

- > Total catch: 40 NP, 0.08 mT (175 lbs.)
- Overall size range: 525 mm to 740 mm TL (21 to 29 inches), weight: 1,159 g to 3,223 g (2.5 to 7.1 lbs.)
- Males averaged 645 mm TL (25 inches), 1,928 g (4.3 lbs.)
- Females averaged 661 mm TL (26 inches), 2,146 g (4.7 lbs.)
- Females made up an estimated 43% of the total catch (Table 1), of which an estimated 100% were sexually mature (Table 2)
- Removed 17 mature females
- No NP were <450 mm TL (18 inches)

Mechanical Suppression Bycatch Summary:

➤ 14 fish species, 289 individuals (Table 3)

Spring Pike Index Netting

- Netting took place between May 9 and May 11
- Net placement sites were selected using a spatially balanced random sampling design focused on the upper section of the reservoir (Box Canyon Dam to Metaline Falls)
- One 3-person crew deployed 15 nets/day
- > Collected biological information such as weight, length, sex, and maturity on all Northern Pike
- > Total nets deployed: 30
- Overall CPUE for Boundary Reservoir was 0.20 NP/net-night.

SPIN catch summary (Table 1)

- > Total catch: 6 NP, 0.01 mT (23 lbs.)
- Overall size range: 485 mm to 675 mm TL (19 to 26 inches), 829 g to 2,170 g (1.8 to 4.8 lbs.)
- Males Averaged 672 mm TL (26 inches) and 2,170 g (4.8 lbs.)
- Females averaged 598 mm TL (19 inches) and 1,613 g (3.5 lbs.)
- Females made up 83% of the total catch, of which 60% were mature, ripe or spawned out
- ➤ No NP were <450 mm TL (18 inches)
